The second office in the congregation that Paul mentions is the "deacon" (diakon) They are bondservants to Christ, but voluntary servants to the congregation for which He died.

Paul's Greeting to the congregation, God's grace and favour manifested towards mankind or to an individual, which as a free act is no more hindered by sin than it is conditional upon works.

Peace (eirene) that sense of contentment a rest and well being in contrast to strife, that comes from knowing that one is a child of God.

Whenever Paul thought about his brethren in Philippi he thanked God for them. It is a lovely thing when remembrance is bound up with gratitude. if we look for that which is a cause of thanksgiving in our brethren and mention this in our prayers. That will help to guard us against wrong attitudes.

Love, guided by knowledge and regulated by balanced judgement, will enable us to make the right choices. Growth in Christ involves the ability to decide the best between two alternatives.

Paul's joyful confidence is rooted in two great supports.
One human and the other divine, both linked very closely.
The prayers of the brethren. The help of the Holy Spirit.
Paul speaks about his eager expectation; that is,
His concentrated gaze fixed on Jesus
to the exclusion of everything else.

Paul appeals to four basic facts of the Christian life that his readers have experienced and he appeals to these to motivate them to live consistently with their calling. These four things are:-

- 1) Encouragement in Christ. 2) Incentive of love.
- 3) Participation in the Spirit. 4) Affection and sympathy.

This is a major theme of the Philippian letter.

Jesus' mind was one that sought the well being of others.

Paul rejoices in the fact that the gospel is preached, Brethren were motivated by his bonds. Paul desires to be a part of the Philippians progress in the gospel. And calls upon the Philippians to walk worthy of the gospel of Christ. God has "granted" the Christian to both believe and suffer on behalf of Christ

The Christian is a light bearer in the world, not only by his personal character, but also by means of 'the Word of Life.' Life without word is an uninterpreted parable The Word without life is idle gossip. The Christian is to live to help others come to know the Word of Life.

Philippians 3:1-3; No Confidence in the Flesh A battle for the souls of men was taking place on the spiritual landscape of Paul's days as there is now. If the Philippians wander into the landscape of these men's false teaching they may be torn to shreds. (spiritually killed.) This appears to be a strong denunciation of the Christian Jews who continued to teach that circumcision was necessary for salvation.

Philippians 3:4-11; To Be Found in Jesus Redemption is found only by God's Grace. Paul's faith gains him righteousness through the blood of Christ. "For God made Christ, who never sinned, to be the offering for our sin, so that we could be made right with God through Christ."

Why then aim at perfection if perfection is impossible to achieve? Because if you aim at anything less you will achieve less. Paul's prayer is to be "found in Christ" through the forgiveness of sins

because you have been Saved from your sins.
Keep on rejoicing, don't stop rejoicing!
