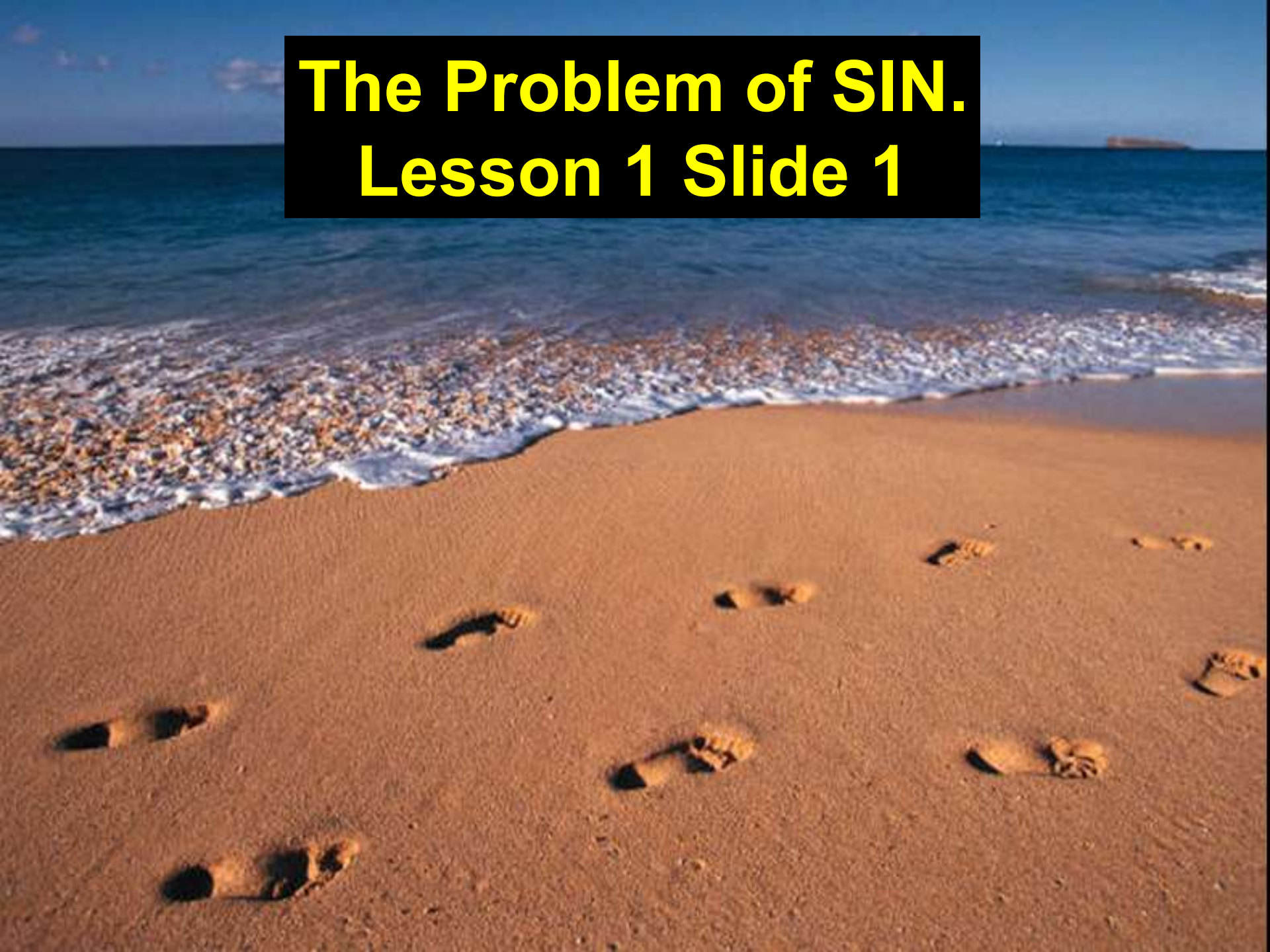

THE PROBLEM OF SIN

Objective:- To understand the process of sin as shown in James 1:13-15; and to examine our reactions towards temptation.

At the centre of all man's trouble is SIN, and at the centre of sin is 'I' .

Sin is doing what 'I' want instead of what God intended me to do.

It is rebelling against God.

Remember, when someone wants to do wrong it is never God who is tempting him.

For God never wants us to do wrong and never tempts anyone else to do it.

Everyone is put to the test by being attracted and seduced by that person's own wrong desire.

SIN AND EVIL:- WHO CAN ANSWER?

The Agnostic?

Why ask? – You Cannot know!

The Atheist (Naturalist)?

Who are you asking? – If there is no one to ask!

The Pantheist (New Age)?

What question?– They do not believe Sin/Evil is real!

The Theist?

If God exists, then the question is valid and the theist can offer some valid answers!



SIN AND EVIL:- WHO CAN ANSWER?

Muslims believe that suffering is due to God. Anything that happens is the will of Allah. If you are suffering, that is God's will for you.

Hindus, by contrast, will tell you that your suffering is not so much God's fault as your fault."

How can Jesus help US?

"He claims that there is only one way to God?

John 14:6; "Jesus told him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one can come to the Father except through me."

"Aren't we being a bit arrogant and exclusive?"

Christ's claims and proof of claims are totally unique
compared to any other major religious leaders.

Buddha claimed to point to the way.
Muhammad claimed to be a **prophet** of God.

Jesus Christ is the only major religious leader
that **ever claimed to be God**, who **fulfilled**
prophecy, lived a sinless life, and then died on
the cross and rose from the dead.”

Remember the times in which we live!**



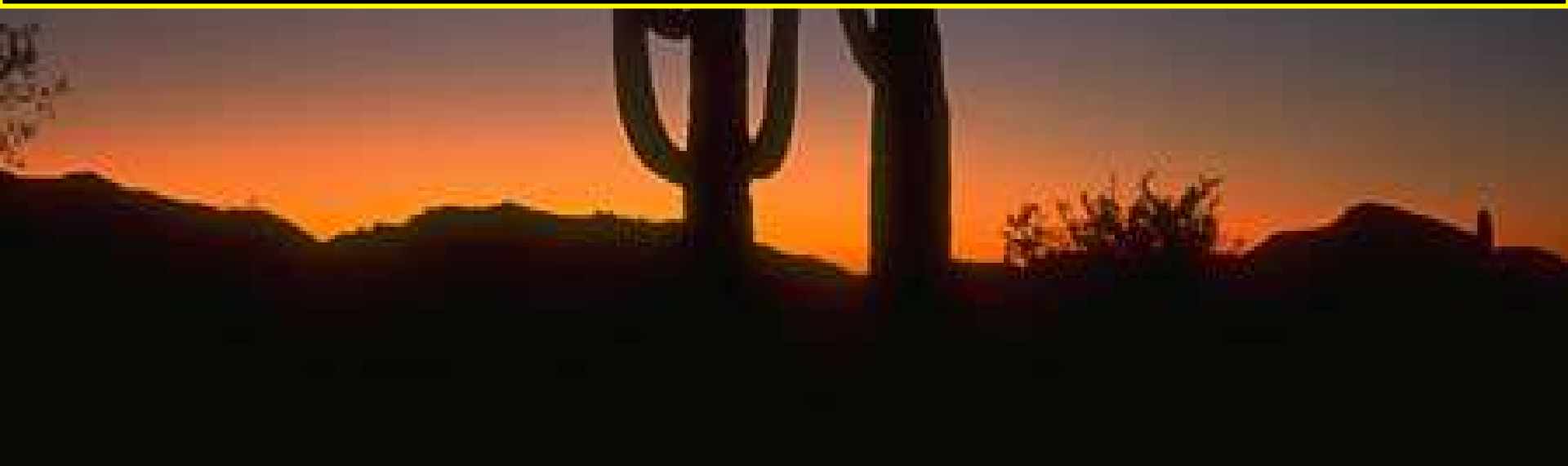

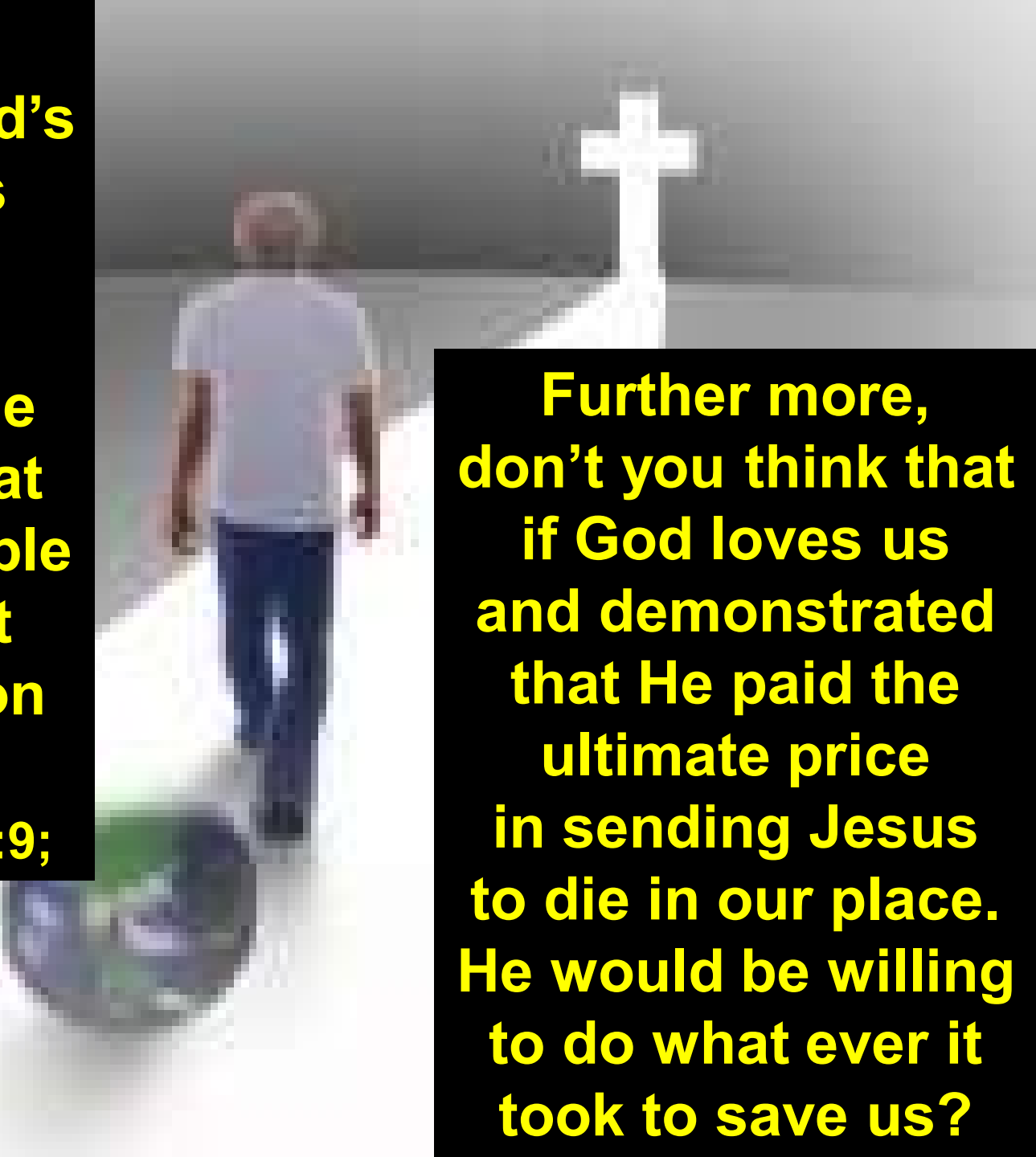
**Furthermore,

Straight Line = Standard.

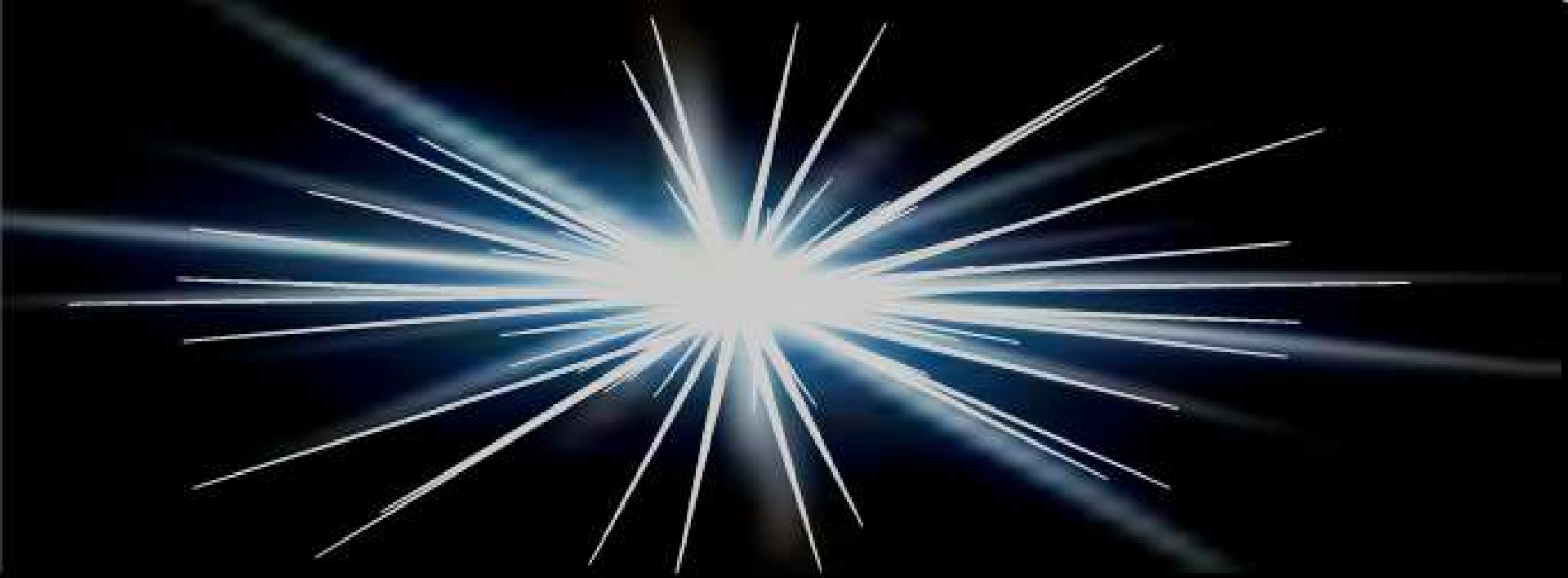


Argument Against God.

Man performs the acts of freedom.”**

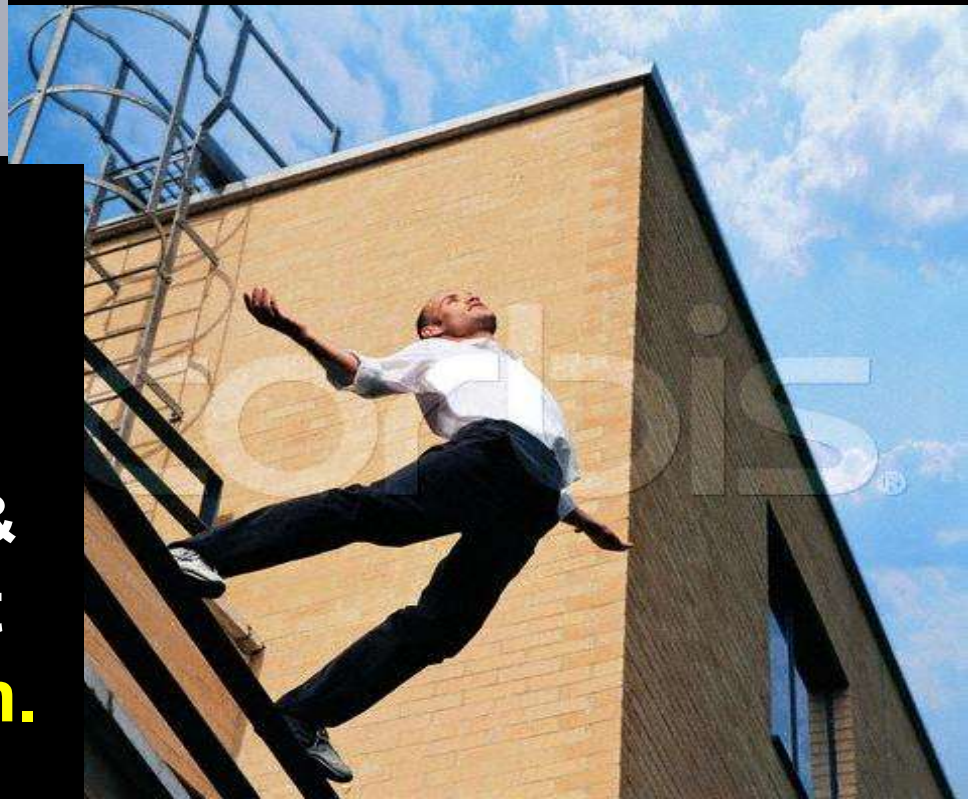
**“God made Sin & evil POSSIBLE,

(Sin Evil & Suffering?)**

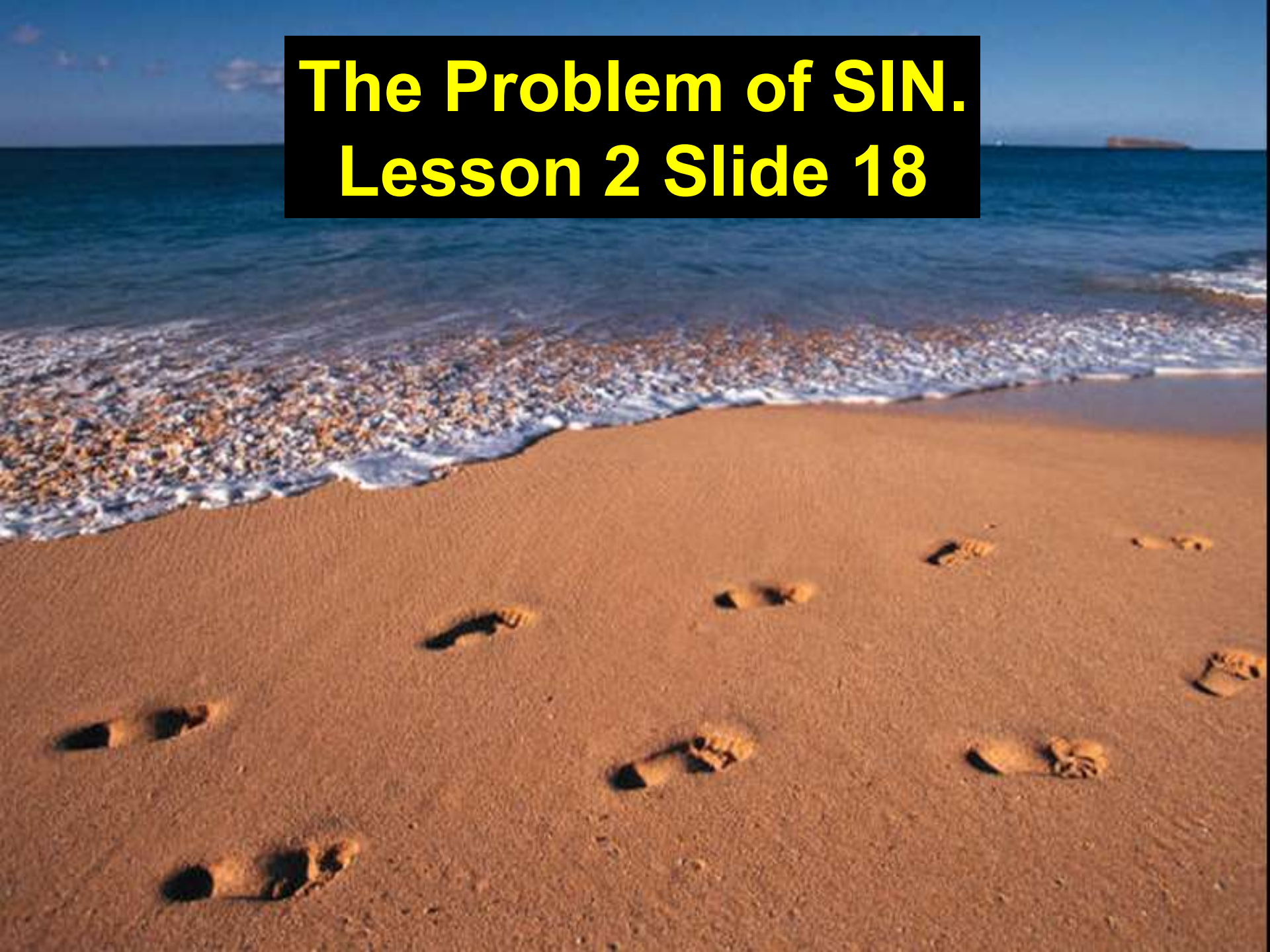
**He can but He won't.

"How do I make someone **love me
without violating their free will?"**



Have you ever chosen to do something you knew was wrong? **The Bible calls those wrong actions sin.** In a general sense, sin means that when **God gives us a law (or commandment)**, and we refuse to do it, this makes us **without law, or lawless.**

"Whoever commits sin commits lawlessness, and sin is lawlessness." 1 John 3:4;

BREAKING OR VIOLATION of GOD'S LAW IS SIN.
Lawlessness is from,
the Greek word **ANOMIA** the Amplified Bible says:-

"Everyone who **commits (practices) sin** is guilty of lawlessness; for (that is what) sin is - lawlessness. (the **breaking, violating of God's law by transgression** or neglect; being unrestrained and unregulated by His commands and His will."

We see that this passage is teaching us that **sin is a personal refusal to be governed by God's divine law and a setting up of our will against God's will.**

1 Jn 1:8; "If we say, "We are without sin," **we deceive ourselves**, and the truth is not in us.

10. If we say, "We have not sinned," **we make Him a liar**, and His word is not in us."

NOTE that **this text** implies that there is a **divine will or standard** against which **all, things are measured**.

This is not very popular in an age of "**do your own thing**" or "**if you feel like it do it**" or let there be "**freedom without restraint**" this really means anarchy. **Freedom brings responsibility to use the freedom wisely.**

In other words, **the Bible teaches that certain things are wrong, such as stealing.**

Paul says plainly:- Eph 4:29;

"Let him who is stealing, steal no longer."

Stealing is wrong:- If we steal, we have broken God's law - we have sinned.

Thieves are counted among the **unrighteous**
who **shall not inherit the kingdom of heaven.**

1 Cor 6:9-10;

Rejecting Truth is also sin, The Bible is Truth.

**One book of the New Testament
that discusses the subject of sin is Romans.**

**“It is not as though man has never known truth;
he has turned away from it and rejected it.”**

Romans 1:18-20;

**These verses show how mankind
has treated God and His Word.**

**"Because, although they knew God,
they did not glorify Him as God, nor were thankful,
but became futile in their thoughts,"**

**"their foolish hearts were darkened. Professing
themselves to be wise, they became fools,
and changed the glory of the incorruptible God
into an image made like corruptible man and
birds and four-footed beasts and creeping things."**

**"Therefore God also gave them up to uncleanness,
in the lusts of their hearts, to dishonour their bodies among
themselves, who exchanged the truth of God for the lie,
and worshipped and served the creature rather than the
Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen." Romans 1:21-25;**

God wants all men to know the Truth:-
that is the reason He gave us the Bible.

**If we reject His message,
He will let us become fools.**

He will allow us to be **blinded by error**
(things that are not true)
and even to be lost eternally. 2 Cor 4:3-4);

He will allow us to be deceived by false teachings.

Many have already perished "**because they
did not receive the love of the truth.**" 2 Thess 2:10;

Do WE love the Truth?

"What is the worst sin?" Rom 1:29-31;

"Unrighteousness, wickedness, evil, envy, murder, strife, deceit, malice, gossip, slander, blasphemy, insolence, sexual perversion homosexuality, arrogance, pride, disobedience to parents, bad language, hypocrisy, drunkenness, rape, adultery."

"..the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men."

Rom 1:18;.

Each sin bears the same consequences.

"And the person who keeps all of the laws except one is as guilty as the person who has broken all of God's laws."

James 2:10;

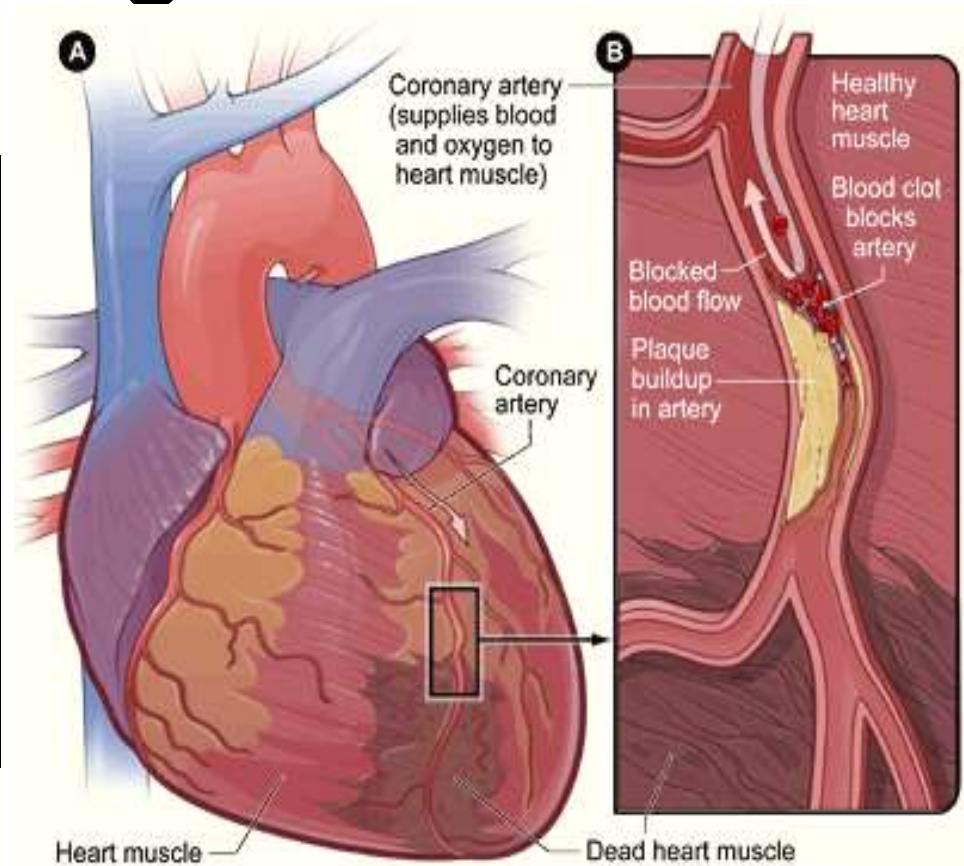
We live in a world of alienation.

What causes a blockage of grace?

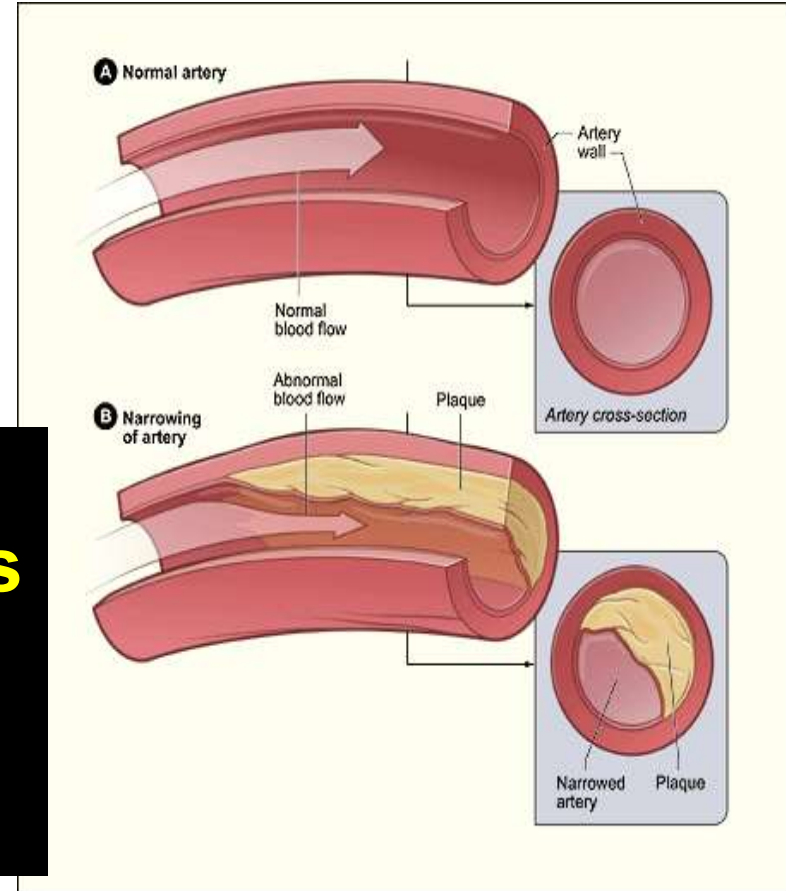

Sin is pretending that we are the center of the universe. It's an "I" problem ... the "I" swells up and becomes an *obstacle to grace.*

Sign: first it will hurt ... then it will diminish ... then it will begin to die.

Consider:-

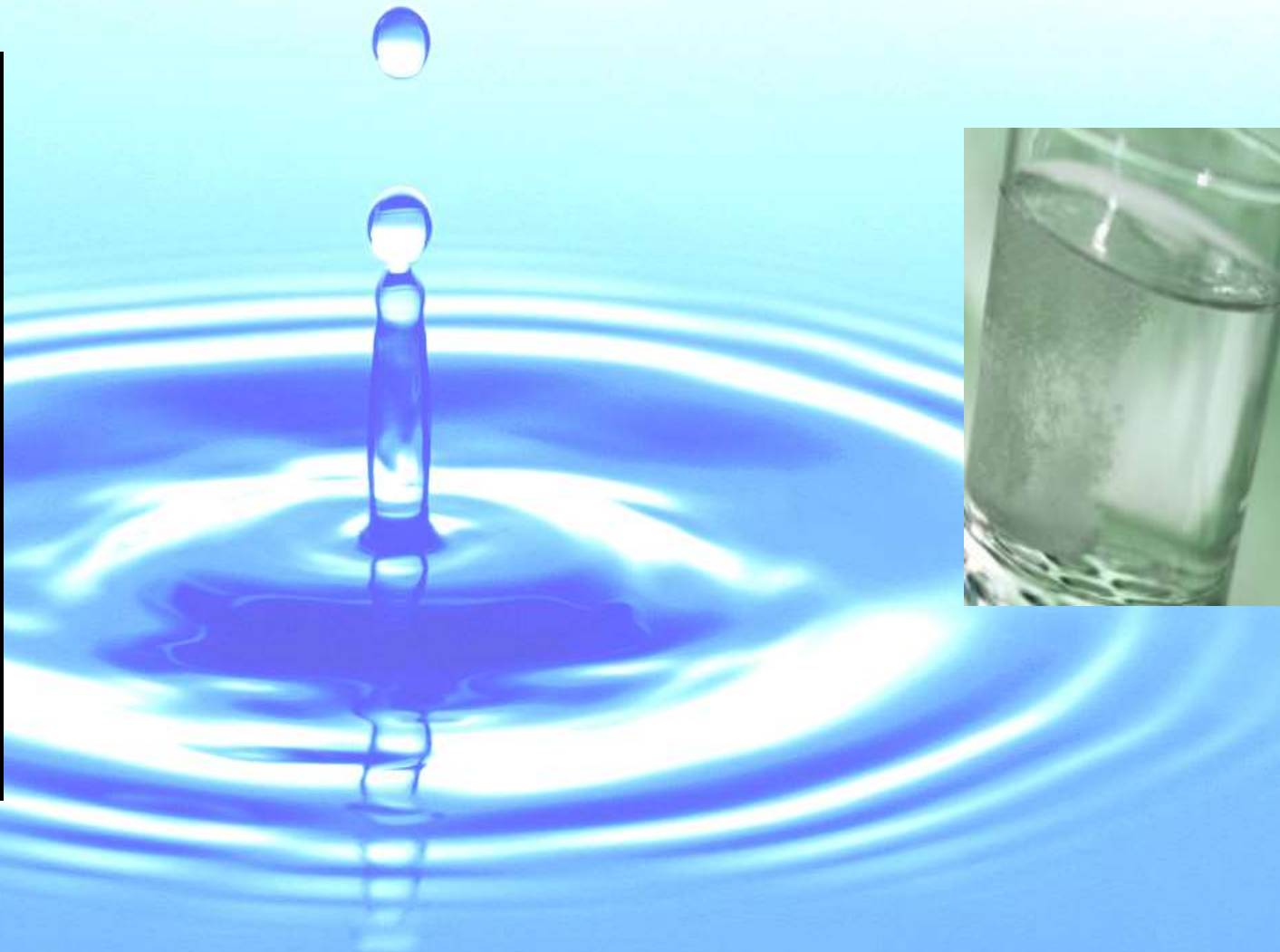
- a) Eve's sin. - Fruit Stealing?

Sin is serious Heb 2:1-2; 1 Pet 4:17-19; Heb 10:26-31;
To treat sin lightly is very dangerous.
God hates sin and must punish it.

He cannot just brush it aside.
His righteousness
demand the penalty be met.

Suppose you were drinking some water out of a paper cup. Would it be acceptable for me to put a little SEWAGE in your water?

If not do you see how something can seem so small but in reality still have a huge impact?



So is it possible **our “sins”** could cause a bigger barrier between us and God than we think?

Picture a young women getting out of the car in her beautiful white wedding dress. Then imagine another car pulling up right next to her and a man with grease all over him getting out. As he gets out and passes by her, he smears grease all over her beautiful white wedding dress.



Now, do you think that wedding dress is going to acceptable to her?

Of course not, because the dress has to be spotless on her special day!

“Now if you and I have a standard of what is right and wrong and we don’t live up to it, can you imagine that God’s standard might be a little higher than our own?” (Matt 5:48; Jas 2:10;)

(James 1:13-17;)**

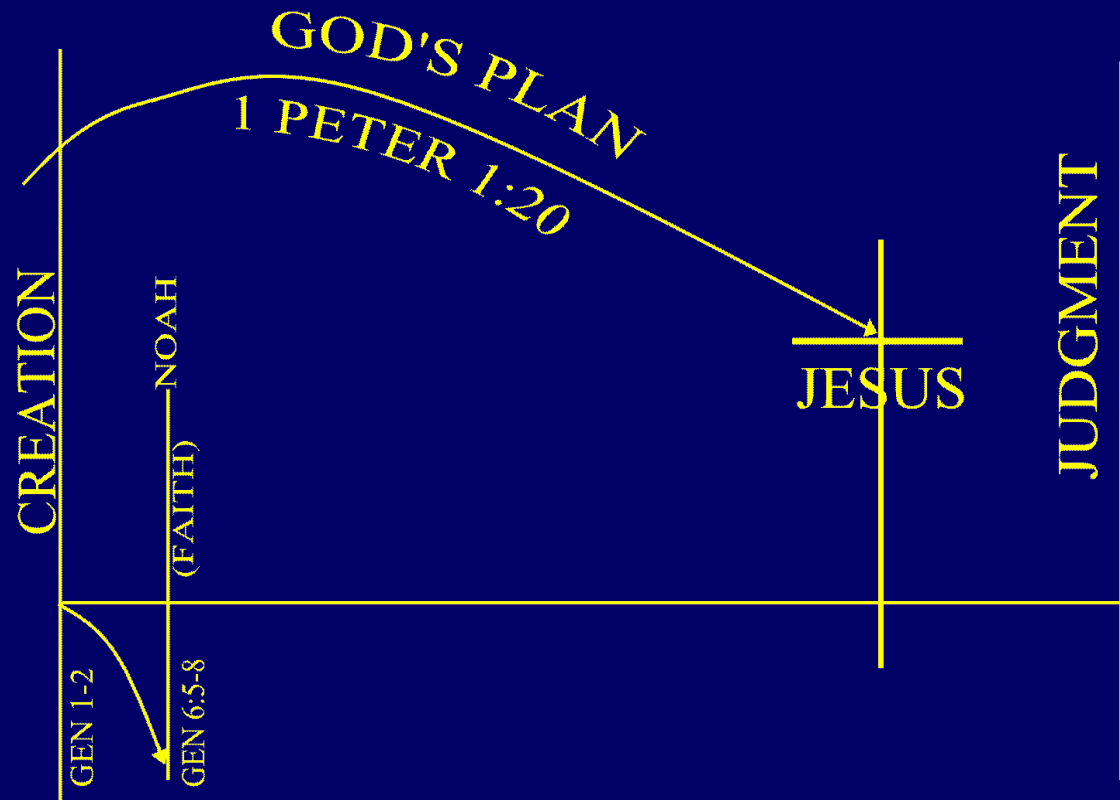
The Problem Of Sin.

Without God's help man would be **without hope** to **save himself** from **sin** and **its consequences**.

Definitions of sin.

1 John 3:4; Lawlessness.

James 4:17; Failure to do what we know to be right and good.

Rom 14:23; Failure to act according to personal conviction and conscience when the bible is silent on an issue.

Rom 3:23; Falling short- not attaining a set target or goal.

Conclusion:- = SIN is disobedience.

THE PROBLEM OF SIN.

“We- every one of us- have strayed away like sheep! We, who left God's paths to follow our own. Yet God laid on him the guilt and sins of every one of us!”

Isaiah 53:6;

“But all have turned their backs on Him; they are filthy with sin--corrupt and rotten through and through. Not one is good, not one!”

Psalms 53:3;

“We are all infected and impure with sin. When we put on our prized robes of righteousness we find they are but filthy rags. Like autumn leaves we fade, wither and fall. And our sins, like the wind, sweep us away.” **Isaiah 64:6;**

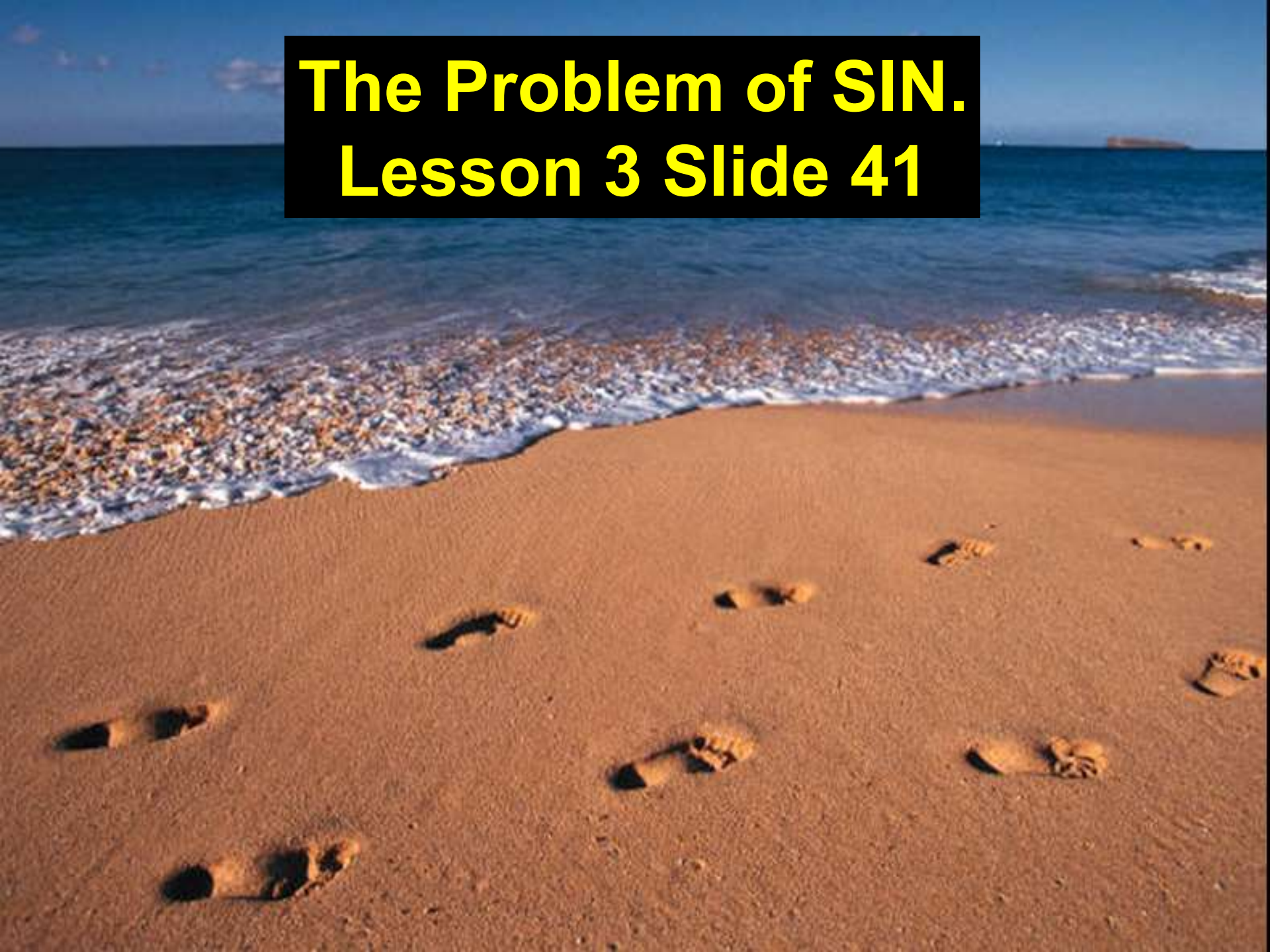

Adam And Eve Yielded To The Temptation.

**There Are
Two Kinds Of Death
That We Read About
In Scripture.**

**The One Most Familiar To Us
Is Physical Death.
Where Our Spirit Separates
From Our Physical Body.**



Spiritual Death.

The Other Kind Of Death
Is **Spiritual Death** Where
Our **Sin Separates Us**
From Fellowship With God.

It Is Probable That This
Passage In Genesis Is
speaking About **Both Kinds**
Of Death. For as well as being
separated from God.

After they left the Garden **their**
cells would begin the process
that will lead to physical death.

Gen 2:16-17;
“And the LORD God
commanded the
man, “You are free
to eat from any tree
in the garden; but
you must not eat
from the tree of the
knowledge of good
and evil, for when
you eat of it in dying
you will die.”

The Consequences of sin.

“You ask: “Why is not the son charged with the guilt of his father?” Because the son has done what is right and just, and has been careful to observe all my statutes, he shall surely live.”

“Only the one who sins shall die.

The son shall not be charged with the guilt of his father, nor shall the father be charged with the guilt of his son.

The virtuous man's virtue shall be his own, as the wicked man's wickedness shall be his.” Ezek 18:19-20;

**Sooner or later everyone sins.
Ezekiel 18:20; makes clear
that all of us will be responsible
for our own sin.**



New Born Children Are Innocent.

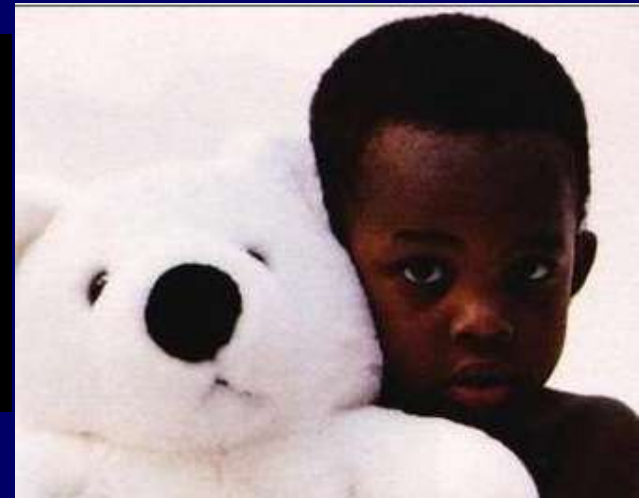
When a child is born, he is not guilty for his parents sin, his grandparents', or his great grandparents'.

Many people believe we are born already separated from God due to Adam's sin.

The bible does not teach this.

Those who believe this often sprinkle their children (calling it baptism) and say that takes care of their sin problem.

But God wants us to realize that we have a problem with sin and need the blood of Jesus Christ to wash away our sins.



Here are two more passages that speak about children and God's kingdom.

Matthew 18:1-3;

"At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" He called a little child and had him stand among them. And he said: "I tell you the truth, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven."

Matthew 19:13-15;

"Then little children were brought to Jesus for him to place his hands on them and pray for them. But the disciples rebuked those who brought them. Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." When he had placed his hands on them, he went on from there."

Greatest In His Kingdom.

Not only does Jesus say that children are in His kingdom, but He says they are the greatest ones there.



Children do not have a broken relationship with God until they are old enough to be accountable for their sin.

Deuteronomy 1:39; see also Rom 9:10-11; “And the little ones that you said would be taken captive, your children who do not yet know good from bad - they will enter the land. I will give it to them and they will take possession of it.”

Little Children Are Not Accountable.

**God does not hold the children accountable
for the sins of their parents.**

**They don't understand the eternal
consequence of sin and
how to seek the solution for it.**

**They will become responsible for their
sin before God when they are old
enough to understand these things.**

The Consequences of sin.

GUILT. / SHAME.

A hardening of the heart- i.e. a callous attitude, learning to live with it instead of fighting it.

Sin spoils : - Think about how each of the following sins has an effect.

**God by His very nature
must separate Himself from sin.**

**What are some of the attributes or qualities of God
that show His separateness from sin?**

**Psalm 145:17; “The Lord is righteous in all His ways,
Gracious in all His works.”**

**Rom 1:18; “But God shows his anger from heaven
against all sinful, wicked people who push the truth
away from themselves.”**

**Isa 6. “Then I said:
‘Woe is me! I am lost,
for I am a man of unclean lips
and I live among a people of unclean lips,
and my eyes have seen the King, Yahweh Sabaoth.”**

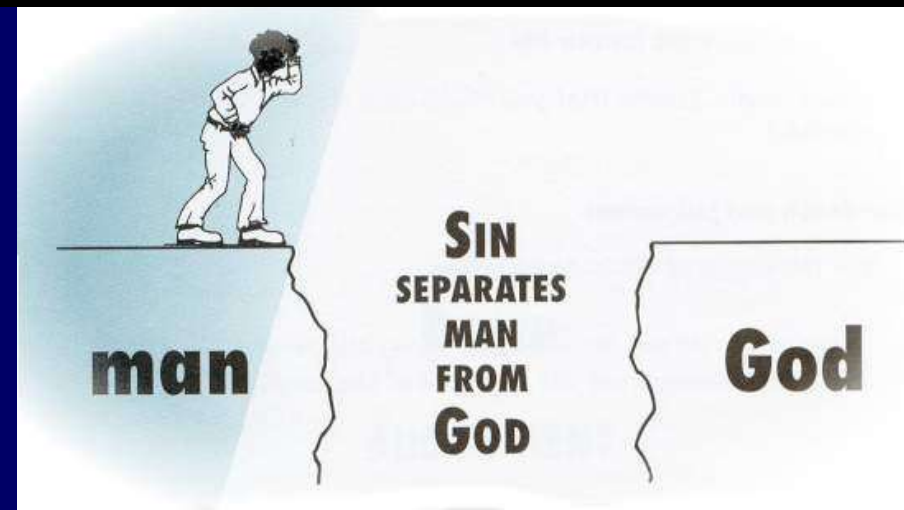
Separation from God was caused by their Sins.

Paul says how they got into this situation.

**“they followed the ways of this world
and desires of their flesh.”**

**You and I are just like them, we have
followed the passions of our flesh, too.**

**We must seek the same solution that
God promised them, or at the day of judgment
we will receive God's Wrath.**



Adam and Eve were forced away from God's presence because God cannot fellowship with sin, other places in the bible speak to this truth as well.

“This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in Him there is no darkness at all. If we claim to have fellowship with Him yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live by the truth.” 1 John 1:5-6

**God Is Pure, Holy, Righteous, And Just.
darkness is used to picture the ugliness of sin
and its unacceptable nature.**

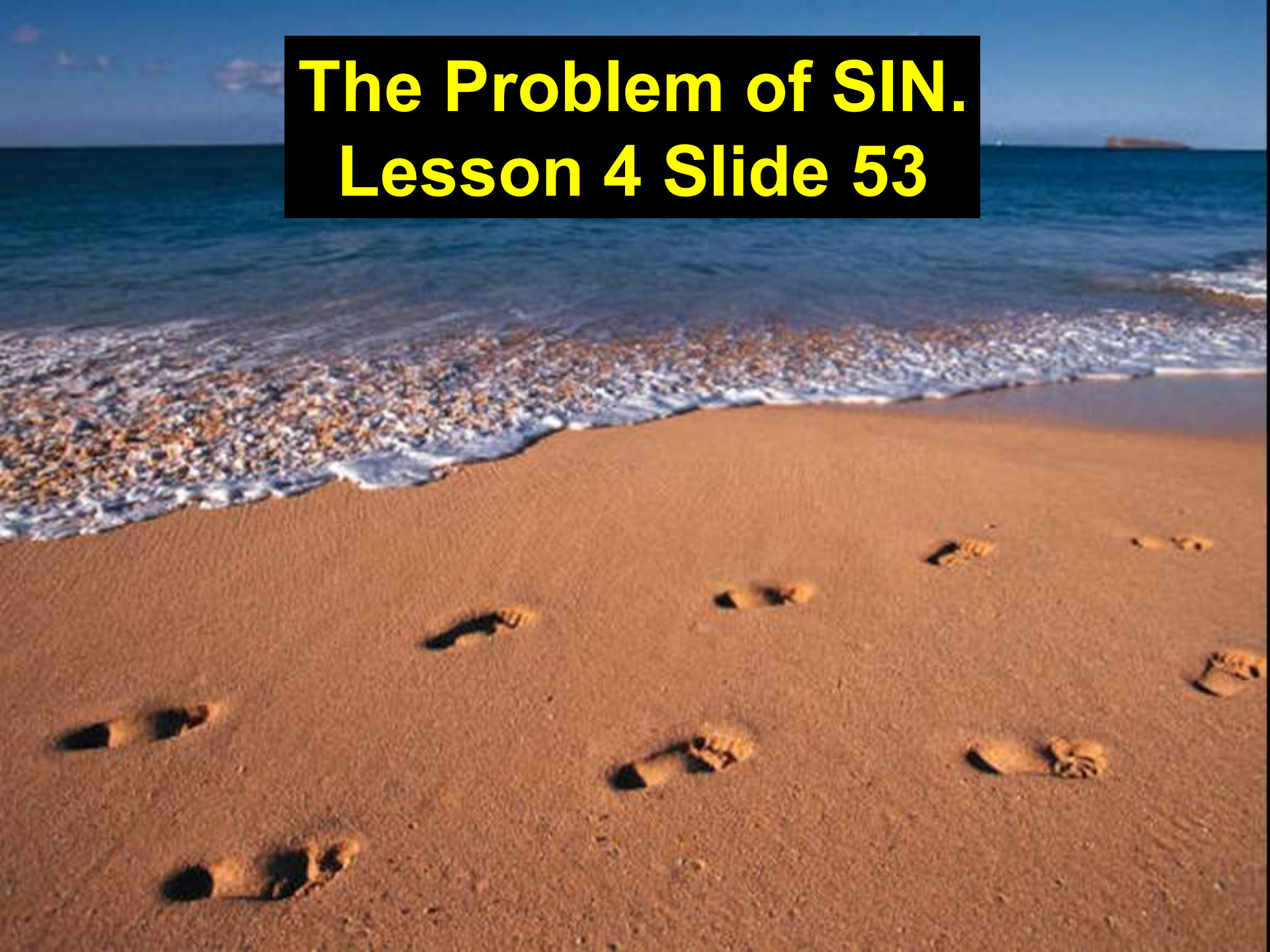

Before you can appreciate the full value of the solution that God provided through Jesus.

We must understand the severity of the problem that sin causes, our eternal separation from God.

If we die physically while we are spiritually separated from God.

We will be separated from Him forever.

Through Jesus, God provides the way for us to accept His Grace, Forgiveness, And Mercy.

**This means that He will restore us,
bought by the blood of Jesus,
redeemed back into a relationship with Him.**

"ALL HAVE SINNED"

When God chose Abraham and his descendants to be His own special people, there became two classes of people in the world:-

Abraham's children (who were later called Jews,)
and
Gentiles (people from every other nation
in the entire world.)

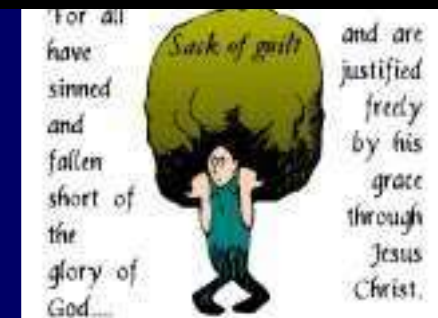
In the book of Romans, the apostle Paul shows that both Jews and Gentiles are guilty of sin.
The Gentiles rejected Truth and became worshipers of idols.

The Jews were given God's holy law.
But they did not keep it.

**Everyone (Jew or Gentile) who has made
the wrong choices has committed sin.**



We need to put **our name** in the circle on the left
Because **our sins separate us** from God.



The Sin Problem.

**There is nothing we can do by ourselves
to solve the sin problem.**

**We can never do enough good deeds
so that God will ignore or disregard our sins.**

**We can not earn or buy our way back
into a relationship with Him.**

**God chose to provide the solution
to the problem by sending Jesus
to pay the price for our sins.**

SOME ATTITUDES TOWARDS SIN...

This is the keynote of our study:-

What is our attitude towards sin.

For attitudes determine actions.

Prov 4:23; 23:7; Matt 15:18-20;

What are some BAD attitudes.

Some people **DENY SIN**:-

They speak of sin as a mere MENTAL AGITATION,
or THEOLOGICAL ABSTRACTION,
or AN INVENTION OF PREACHERS,
TO KEEP THEM IN A JOB.

But what does the Bible say?:-

1 Jn 3:4; sin is **LAWLESSNESS.**

**Did you know that the Bible
has 21 lists dealing with sin.**

**Matt 15:18-20; Rom 1:18-28;
1 Cor 5:9-11; Gal 5:19-21; etc.**

The Bible says that sin is a universal problem.

1 King 8:46; Ecc 7:20; Rom 3:23; 5:12;

**The Bible was written to help to convince
man of sin, and tell of God's solution.**

Rom 7:7; Lk 19:10; Acts 18:28; Titus 1:9;

Not only they deny, but some people MOCK SIN.

**They turn sin into a JOKE. Prov 14:9; 10:23;
Sin should make us mourn rather than mock
because of its serious consequences.**

Some people LOVE SIN.

**Mic 3:2; 2 Pet 2:15; 1Jn 2:15-17; Psa 52:3-4;
Prov 17:19; Rev 22:15;**

**Men have pleasure in that which they love
therefore the Bible speaks of
pleasure in unrighteousness.**

2 Thess 2:10-12; 2 Tim 3:4; Prov 21:17; Rom 1:23;

**When we say that we love sin,
we are saying that we love that which
led to the crucified Christ.**

Rom 4:25; Gal 1:4;

Some people **MINIMISE SIN.**

Sin is a mere "defect of the temper"
or someone was just "misdirected" or sin is
just a carry over from an unenlightened age.

Or young people will be young people!
or a leopard cannot change its spots!
or they will grow out of it.

**We sometimes classify
sin to make it not so bad.**

We agree that murder and lying are terrible,
but what about ingratitude, or discontent,
murmuring, gossip and malice.

What about "lack of self discipline?"

(we know how to discipline others.)

Or lack of zeal in evangelism, is it because we no longer see sin as an urgent problem?

We no longer see it as **soul destroying**?

**If we have light thoughts on sin
we will never have great thoughts on God...**

Some just **DISMISS IT** from their minds.

Acts 24:25; Felix. Acts 17:32; Athenians.

Sin is worse than cancer, **it will not go away**
if we ignore it. It has not just physical
but **everlasting** spiritual consequences.

WHAT ARE PROPER ATTITUDES TOWARDS SIN..

We should ADMIT IT.

Psa 51:3-4; 1 Jn 1:8-10; Lk 18:13; 1 Tim 1:15;

8. “If we say we have no sin, we are only fooling ourselves and refusing to accept the truth.
9. But if we confess our sins to him, he is faithful and just to forgive us and to cleanse us from every wrong.
10. If we claim we have not sinned, we are calling God a liar and showing that his word has no place in our hearts.”

We should HATE SIN. Prov 8:13; Amos 5:15;
Ex 18:21; Psa 97:10; 119:104,113; Rev 2:6; Jude 23;

We usually avoid things we hate.

Not many of us would keep a box full of tarantulas in the house. if we hate it we keep our distance from it and it will be less likely to effect us.

We know that God hates sin. Deut 16:22; Prov 6:16-19;

We should SHUN sin. Rom 12:9;
Shrink from sin. 1Thess 5:22;
Abstain from sin. 2 Tim 2:22;
We are to flee from sin. Matt 6:13;
Pray, and don't make provision (plan) for sin.
Rom 13:14;

**We know that Jesus reacted to sin
with righteous indignation.**
Mk 3:5; Jn 2:13-17; Heb 1:9;

“Then he turned to his critics and asked, “Is it legal to do good deeds on the Sabbath, or is it a day for doing harm? Is this a day to save life or to destroy it?” But they wouldn't answer him. 5. **He looked around at them angrily, because he was deeply disturbed by their hard hearts.**

Then he said to the man, “Reach out your hand.”

The man reached out his hand, and it became normal again!”

We are to EXPOSE sin- Because:-
God condemns sin. Rom 8:3;
The Holy Spirit rebukes sin. Jn 16:7-8; Acts 2:36;
Jesus exposed sin. Matt 7:15-20; Lk 20:45-47;
John Baptist condemned sin. Mk 1:5; Matt 14:1-12;

The apostles denounced sin.
Acts 13:6-10; 17:22-31; 24:25;

Preachers/elders are to rebuke sin.
2 Tim 4:1-2; 1 Tim 5:20; Tit 1:13; 2:15;
All Christians are to rebuke sin. Eph 5:1-10;

Eph 5:1-7; “Follow God's example in everything you do, because you are his dear children. 2. **Live a life filled with love for others**, following the example of Christ, who loved you and gave Himself as a sacrifice to take away your sins. And God was pleased, because that sacrifice was like sweet perfume to Him.”

“3. Let there be no sexual immorality, impurity, or greed among you. Such sins have no place among God's people. 4. Obscene stories, foolish talk, and coarse jokes **these are not for you.** **Instead, let there be thankfulness to God.**”

“Don't be fooled by those who try to excuse these sins, for the terrible anger of God comes upon all those who disobey him. **7. Don't participate in the things these people do.**”

We are to CONQUER SIN:—

**Not commit it, nor continue in it. Rom 6:1-7;
Jesus taught that sometimes it takes drastic action
to conquer sin. Mk 9:43-48;**

If we do not conquer sin it will conquer us.

**If we are able to be over comers
we will receive a blessing from God.**

Rev 2:7,11,17,26; 3:5;12, 21;

**WHAT IS SIN? We have discussed
attitudes towards it both good
and bad but what is it?**

A VIOLATION OF YOUR CONSCIENCE IS SIN.

Rom 14:23; “But if people have doubts about whether they should eat something, **they shouldn't eat it.**”

“They would be condemned for not acting in faith before God. If you do anything you believe is not right, you are sinning.”

Faith here is spoken of as a **contrast** to **doubt**, therefore it is not talking about the gospel as faith but **rather your individual convictions, opinions and faith.**

The Amplified bible says "But the man who has doubts-misgivings- an uneasy conscience- about eating, and then eats (perhaps because of you) stands condemned (before God) because he is not true to his convictions, and does not act from faith,"

"for whatever does not originate in and proceed from faith is sin, that is whatever is done without a conviction of approval by God is sinful"

The conscience in and of itself is NOT a safe guide
Acts 23:1; 24:17; Our consciences must be educated by the word of God. and once so educated should not be violated - remember when you fight with your uneducated conscience and lose - you win...

These verses show the sin of failing to do Good.
We are not only to be harmless - but helpful.

If we see some problem we ought to deal with
and do not deal with it, it is sin, if we know someone
who needs encouraging and fail to encourage!

Or someone in a need we can help with
and fail to?:-

Remember what Jesus said in Matt 25:31-46;
YOU DID NOT.....

A BREAKING OR VIOLATION of GOD'S LAW IS SIN.

1 Jn 3:4; TRANSGRESSION is from the Greek word **ANOMIA** and means **lawlessness**.

So the Amplified Bible says:-

"Everyone who commits (practices) sin is guilty of lawlessness; for (that is what) sin is - lawlessness (the breaking, violating of God's law by transgression or neglect; being unrestrained and unregulated by His commands and His will."

So we see that this passage is teaching us that **sin is a personal refusal** to be **governed by God's divine law** and a setting up of **our will against God's will**.

We need to follow the example of Jesus:-

them at every opportunity. Matt 4:4-11;.**

**Jesus Was Tempted Just Like We Are,
Yet He Never Yielded To The Temptation.**

Hebrews 4:15-16; “Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has gone through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess.”

We need to Speak to other Christians about our struggles Jam 5:16; But be we need to be careful in our choice of who to share with.

We need to replace old attitudes and desires with new ones Rom 12:1-3;. This is accomplished by:-

Reading the scriptures, thinking about them, meditating upon them, and applying them.

Keeping our mind on Jesus through developing a prayer life. Phil 4:6-7;

Trying to avoid bad company, literature, programmes, etc. 1 Cor 15:33;

We need to realize that **failure as well as success** will **sometimes be the outcome**, but God has already made provision for us in those circumstances.

1 Jn 1:7; also 1 Jn 2:1;.

Read Rom 7:15-19; Paul describes **the struggle with sin**.

- a) Salvation. b) Atonement. c) Reconciliation.
d) Justification. e) Redemption.**

We need to be able to identify which one of these words would describe what is being spoken of in these passages. (salvation etc.)

- a) Rom 4:25; b) Acts 4:12;
c) 1 Pet 1:18-19; d) Rom 5:11;**

- e) Rom 1:16; f) Rom 5:18;
g) Eph 1:7;**

**These words were in everyday use in N.T. times
today their meaning is often not quite so clear.**

ATONEMENT:- The word means '**a making at one**'.
It is used to describe the process of bringing together two people that have been estranged.

In the N.T. it is used to describe the work of Jesus dealing with the problem of sin and in bringing man back into a right relationship with God.

An easy way to remember it's meaning is to break the word down **AT- ONE- MENT.**

RECONCILIATION. – RECONCILE.

This word is very similar in meaning and is used to translate the same Greek word as atonement.

When two people are enemies and they sort out their differences and become good friends, this is reconciliation.

We were God's enemies. Rom 5:10;

Jesus takes away the barrier of sin so that we can become His friends.

Also used in 2 Cor 5:18; Eph 2:11; Col 1:19;

REDEEM, REDEMPTION, REDEEMER, RANSOM.

This family of words mean to recover something or someone by paying a price.

The word is used in the following ways:-

- 1. A prisoner of war may be released on payment of a price which is called the ransom money.**
- 2. Kidnappers demand a price for their victim. When the ransom money is paid the victim is said to have been redeemed.**
- 3. You may pawn a gold ring because you need the money.
You go back and redeem it by paying the price.**

REDEEM, REDEMPTION, REDEEMER, RANSOM.

**4. A slave is freed on payment of a ransom price.
For the Christian we are slaves to sin
and unable to get ourselves free.**

**Jesus paid the ransom price,
(His own life) to set us free.**

**We have therefore been redeemed,
- bought back- by Jesus our redeemer.**

**Jesus death on the cross is the ransom.
This is good news for us!.**

JUSTIFICATION.

This is a legal term meaning
to acquit to 'declare one righteous'.

It is the opposite of guilty. Rom 8:33-34;

The judge gives the verdict in your favour.
He pronounces you not guilty.

This is justification.

**We are in fact guilty, but
because Jesus died in our place.**

God now attributes Jesus righteousness to us!

We are declared NOT GUILTY. - JUSTIFIED.

THE PLAN.

God wanted to save men from sin and bring them back to Himself, thus showing His love.

GOD'S PLAN FORMED BEFORE THE WORLD.

God's plan was no after thought.

**It was perfect and complete in God's mind
before the beginning:-**

Eph 1:3-4; 2 Thess 2:13;

**“3. How we praise God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the
heavenly realms because we belong to Christ. 4. Long ago,
even before He made the world, God loved us and chose
us in Christ to be holy and without fault in His eyes.”**

Read Eph 3:7-13; carefully:-

**v9. How did Paul speak of the plan? v10. Through
what was God's wisdom to be made known?
v11. Who did God's eternal purpose involve?**

**Read Luke at some point and
list the main events in the life of Jesus.**

The death of Jesus is central in God's plan.
The death and resurrection of Jesus is seen by God
as the greatest events to affect man
in the whole of world history.

Read careful Acts 2:22-23;
These verses show two sides that lead Jesus to the
cross. 1. God's side – grace. 2. Man's side – sin.

**Acts 2:22-23; "People of Israel, listen!
God publicly endorsed Jesus of Nazareth by doing
wonderful miracles, wonders, and signs
through Him, as you well know."**

**23. But you followed God's prearranged plan.
With the help of lawless Gentiles,
you nailed Him to the cross and murdered Him.**

How does the passage express these two sides?

1. God:-

2. Man:-

**Every one of us who have sinned
have LOST our special relationship,
our fellowship with God.**

**We all deserve to die in our sins,
