

OUR SPIRITUAL CONDITION

The Bible describes us, because of our sin, as being lost, separated from God and unable to save ourselves.

Ours is a hopeless condition indeed.

Yet God wants us to be saved.

The dilemma that faced God was this:



How can He forgive our sins and also carry out the justice that His law demands for violators? God cannot ignore the fact that we have broken His holy law and that carries a severe penalty.

In Jesus Christ, the Father found One whose death would fully satisfy the demands of justice, thereby enabling Him to forgive our sins.



Why Jesus Came / The need for the death of Jesus From the announcement of His conception, the mission of Jesus was linked to our spiritual recovery.

The angel told Joseph that the child Mary was carrying was conceived by the Holy Spirit.

The child was to be named Jesus

"because He will save His people from their sins."

(Matthew 1:21;)



This redemptive theme was echoed throughout the ministry of the Lord Jesus, The Christ.

He said that He had come:"to seek and to save what was lost" and
"to give His life as a ransom for many."
(Luke 19:10; Matthew 20:28;)

23. "for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, 24. being justified as a gift by His grace through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus;"

"25. whom God displayed publicly as a propitiation in His blood through faith. To demonstrate His righteousness, because in the forbearance of God He passed over the sins previously committed; 26. for the demonstration of His righteousness at the present time, so that He would be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus."

Rom 3:23-26; NASB

- 23. "Yes, all have sinned; all fall short of God's glorious ideal; 24. yet now God declares us 'not guilty' of offending him if we trust in Jesus Christ, who in His kindness freely takes away our sins."
- "25. For God sent Christ Jesus to take the punishment for our sins and to end all God's anger against us. He used Christ's blood and our faith as the means of saving us from His wrath. In this way He was being entirely fair, even though He did not punish those who sinned in former times.


 For He was looking forward to the time when Christ would come and take away those sins."

But God shows HIS LOVE for US in that while we were yet SINNERS Christ died for us."

Have you ever felt you are IN OVER YOUR HEAD?
You find yourself doing things
that you DON'T want to do?

YOU FEEL PUSHED by peer pressure to go ALONG WITH THE CROWD. You LACK the strength to stand against them.

When I was young I was challenged to punch the glass out of a window of an old mill and I still have the scars to show for it. WEAK AND HELPLESS, CAUGHT UP IN THE CROWD, wanting to be ACCEPTED, we find ourselves doing things that WE KNOW WE SHOULD NOT BE DOING.

YET PAUL SAYS THAT IS WHEN GOD LOVED US!
-THAT- is when Christ was prepared to die for us!
We need to UNDERSTAND at that moment
DESPITE our SIN, DESPITE ourselves,
God LOVED US ANYWAY.

THE UNGODLY

You know people who you would describe as UNGODLY, and you may have been like that yourself, you're a self made man or woman, you don't need GOD.

You might even say to God I don't believe in you!

I don't want anything to do with you!

Keep out of my LIFE, / Keep out of my WAY,

SCIENCE is my god, / EDUCATION is my god.

WE are GROWN UP - we don't need childish beliefs anymore I don't even believe in Santa Claus anymore.

GOD, you just don't exist and even if you DID I STILL DON'T NEED YOU.

I know that 'sinner' is not a POPULAR WORD today, It is not politically correct. People say 'I am not a liar, I AM JUST ECONOMICAL WITH THE TRUTH!'

From the moral high ground we say:
I AM NOT A MURDERER.

Yet we find ourselves gossiping ("have you heard about Mrs Jones....") WE END UP DESTROYING HER CHARACTER AND TEARING HER REPUTATION TO SHREDS.

Sometimes we sin by doing NOTHING when we OUGHT TO HAVE DONE SOMETHING OR SAID SOMETHING James 4:17; says if you know what you ought to do and fail to do it that is sin.

Yet THAT is when God loved us.

THAT is when Christ was prepared to die for us.

Despite our SINFULNESS, despite our HYPOCRISY

God LOVED US ANYWAY AND ALLOWED

HIS SON TO PAY THE PRICE FOR OUR SIN.



GOD LOVES US ANYWAY AND ALWAYS HAS DONE!

BUT OUR WEAKNESS! OUR ARROGANCE!
AND OUR SINFULNESS!
PLACES a BARRIER BETWEEN US and GOD.



OUR SINS MUST BE PAID FOR, SIN SEPARATES AND GOD KNOWS WE HAVE GOT OURSELVES IN A HOLE AND CANNOT GET OURSELVES OUT.

Because of His LOVE for US
HE ALLOWS JESUS TO TAKE OUR PLACE,
TO PAY THE PENALTY / THE PRICE FOR OUR SIN.

EPHESIANS 2:4-7;

- 4. "But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the GREAT LOVE with which He loved us, 5. even when we were DEAD through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved,)"
 - 6. "and raised us up with Him, and made us sit with Him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus,
 - 7. that in the coming ages He might show the immeasurable riches of His grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus."

Most of us DO NOT APPRECIATE what GOD SEES when He looks at the sin in our lives.

We PLAN sin, we EXECUTE the SIN and we think we have got away with it and it does not seem so bad...

EPHESIANS 2:4-7; "But God, who is rich in mercy, EVEN when we were:-

through our trespasses."

WHEN GOD LOOKS at our sins, HE SEES ALL THE DAMAGE the sin has done to us, HE SEES THE INSIDE and ALL THE SCARS it has left.

That WRONG WORD, that VICIOUS ACT, that ARROGANT ATTITUDE, THAT DESTRUCTIVE CRITICISM! Leaves its mark on our lives and on the lives of others.

THE WAY OF SALVATION DO YOU LIKE HEDGEHOGS? They may be spiky and flea-ridden but they are cute, we know when we see them the most - at the side of the road when they are all squashed and flattened.

When you first drive past you say OH! what a shame, but AFTER A FEW DAYS it begins to DECOMPOSE and the MAGGOTS start crawling through it and it begins to SMELL.

We say WOW! SOMEBODY
OUGHT TO DO SOMETHING about that –
it's horrible and it stinks!
We WANT someone to pick it up and
throw it out of our sight, it OFFENDS US.

EPHESIANS 2:4-7;

Yet THAT is the EFFECT OF SIN ON OUR LIVES, that is what GOD SEES in us when SIN LEAVES ITS MARKS ON OUR SOULS!

And GOD'S response to OUR HORRIBLE
MISSHAPEN mess?
HE REACHES OUT IN LOVE AND
ALLOWS CHRIST TO DIE IN OUR PLACE.

THAT WE MIGHT BE SEEN
AS PURE AND BLAMELESS IN HIS SIGHT.
ISN'T THAT WONDERFUL / ISN'T IT MARVELLOUS
GOD LOVES US ANYWAY / GOD LOVES US THAT MUCH!

Ran a ROSE SCENTED BATH for the man and WHEN HE WAS CLEAN & SMELLING WONDERFUL gave him a whole new outfit to wear!

SUIT, COAT, SOCKS, SHOES!

When he came downstairs he saw a **BEAUTIFUL DINNER!** ROAST BEEF, YORKSHIRE PUDDING, (THE BIG ONE NOT THE SMALL ONE,)

APPLE PIE AND CUSTARD.

When he had eaten his fill and was all dressed up our friend gave him some money and let him go on his way clean on the outside at least.

THE LOVE OF GOD

1 John 1:1-3;

- 1. "SEE WHAT LOVE the Father has given us, that we should be CALLED CHILDREN OF GOD; and SO WE ARE.
- The reason why the world does not know us is that it did not know Him."
 - 2. "Beloved, we are God's children now; it does not yet appear what we shall be, but we know that when He appears we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is."
 - 3. "And every one who thus hopes in Him purifies himself as He is pure."

1 John 1:1-3; ONCE WE WERE WEAK, UNGODLY SINNERS AND YET GOD LOVED US!

1 John 3:1; POINTS OUT THAT IN CHRIST WE HAVE BEEN ELEVATED FROM THOSE WHO WALK AWAY FROM GOD, WHO WANT NOTHING TO DO WITH GOD.

TO NOW BEING THOSE IN CHRIST WHOM HE CALLS HIS CHILDREN!

1 John 1:1-3; IN CHRIST JESUS WE NOW HAVE A SPECIAL UNIQUE RELATIONSHIP WITH THE CREATOR OF THE UNIVERSE.

PAUL IN ROMANS SAYS WE CAN CALL HIM

"Abba - father"

We can speak to God ANYTIME

share with Him ANY PROBLEM!

WHY? because He LOVES US and allowed His Son to pay the price for our sins.

Have you ever stood outside of Buckingham Palace and wondered what it would be like to go in and have tea with the Queen?

You go up to the soldier by the gate and ask ANY CHANCE OF GETTING IN?

He doesn't even bother to reply just looks down his nose at you and then ignores you.

You turn round dejected because you are dying for a cup of tea and it would be lovely to have tea with the Queen. As you turn you bump straight into Prince Charles as he is coming up to the gate.

He says hello what are you doing here and you tell him you would have liked to go in for tea.

He puts his arm around your shoulder and says
COME ON THEN, COME IN WITH ME
AND WE'LL HAVE SOME TEA.
HE APPROACHES THE SOLDIER AT THE GATE, THE
SOLDIER DOES A SMART SALUTE AND
LETS YOU GO IN WITH OUT ANY QUESTIONS.

WHY? BECAUSE
YOU ARE WITH THE ONE
WHO CAN GIVE YOU ACCESS,
YOU ARE WITH THE SON!

WE ARE ABLE TO APPROACH THE THRONE OF GOD

BECAUSE WE ARE CHILDREN OF GOD, CLOTHED IN THE RIGHTEOUSNESS OF HIS SON BECAUSE HE LOVES US AND WE HAVE GIVEN OUR LIVES IN TRUST AND OBEDIENCE TO HIM.

THAT SHOWS HOW MUCH GOD LOVES US?
THAT SHOWS GOD LOVES US ANYWAY?

THE LOVE OF GOD

ROMANS 5:6-8; EPHESIANS 2:4-7;

1 JOHN 3:1;

1 JOHN 4:10-11;





1 John 4:10-11;
10. "In this is love, NOT we loved God but that HE loved us and sent his Son to be the EXPIATION for our sins."

11. "Beloved, IF God so loved us, WE ALSO ought to LOVE ONE ANOTHER."

1 John 4:10-11; Just BECAUSE WE ARE A CHILD OF GOD and BECAUSE HE LOVES US ANYWAY does not mean that we have licence to do what we like, because it does not matter!

NO! BECAUSE WE REALISE that God loves us, WE respond with LOVE towards Him by accepting the forgiveness and salvation He offers us.

OUR love ought to make us respond
by wanting to be THE BEST THAT WE CAN BE.
GOD SEES OUR POTENTIAL and WANTS US
TO ACHIEVE THAT POTENTIAL and therefore,
with Him on our side and cheering for us,
WE ought to want to strive to achieve that potential.

If we never try we will never succeed! If we never try we will never fail!

But if we try and fail in some way,
IT DOES NOT MATTER
BECAUSE GOD WILL BE THERE FOR US,
TO PICK US UP AND HELP US TRY AGAIN.
WHY? BECAUSE GOD LOVES US ANYWAY.

HIS LOVE WILL ALWAYS BE THERE FOR US, HE HAS PROVED THAT WITH THE CROSS.

God has set us the example, He is willing to forgive us but He recognizes that we need to change, IF WE WANT A BETTER WORLD - it begins with us.

WE CANNOT CHANGE OTHER PEOPLE
Only God can, and with God's help
we can change OUR attitudes and the way
we talk to and talk about other people.

We live in a society that is CONCERNED WITH SELF God challenges us to be selfless.

Society cries WHATS IN IT FOR ME!

God challenges us to see how we can enable and empower others to reach their goals.

God challenges us to share His love with a world that so badly needs it.

BUT! We might say WHAT WILL IT COST ME?
IT MAY COST YOU EVERYTHING.
It has already cost God His only SON!

THE WAY OF SALVATION How does God save us from our sins? He saved us through Jesus who paid the penalty for our sin. Since we all are guilty of sin, we could not take each other's places.

Only someone without sin could suffer our punishment.

Jesus "committed no sin, nor was guile found in His mouth" (1 Peter 2:22;)

Therefore, He was qualified to take our place.

The price God required to save us was the blood of an innocent sacrifice.
"Without shedding of blood there is no remission" (Hebrews 9:22;).

[Remission means "the forgiveness" of sins.]

Though He was not guilty of committing any sin, Jesus was nailed to a wooden cross by wicked and sinful men. He suffered great pain for hours.

After He died, "a soldier pierced His side with a spear; blood and water came out" (John 19:34;) This blood was offered for our sins. (Hebrews 9:12)

With this blood "Jesus washes our sins away." (Revelation 1:5;) Nothing else can make us clean or remove our sins but the blood of Jesus.

"If our sins are not cleansed by the blood of Jesus, they will continue to separate us from God [and all His goodness] forever." (2 Thess 1:9;)

The Need For The Cross
The cross of Christ vindicates God.
It shows God to be just, in that
He did what His own law demanded.
He is also the one who justifies and
pardons all those who have faith in Jesus.



God has never been short of sacrifices.
Rivers of blood flowed from Israel's altars, yet they were unable to pay the price for sin and satisfy God's justice.

Martyrs too numerous to mention gave their lives sacrificially in the service of the Lord, yet not even their deaths could pay the price of sin.

Father Maximilian Kolbe, a Polish Franciscan priest, caught the attention of the world's press when his noble deed became known.

He was a prisoner in Auschwitz concentration camp. When Kolbe heard that a married man with a family had been selected for execution, he volunteered to take this man's place. Kolbe became a substitute so that another man might live.

Jesus became our substitute
when He took our sins upon Himself:"He Himself bore our sins in His body on the tree."
(1 Peter 2:24;)

The debt incurred by our sins could only be paid by an adequate sacrifice offered on our behalf.

Though two other men died along with Jesus on that day, yet only His death was able to cancel our debt.

Peter captures the concept of Christ being our substitute and Saviour in these words:"Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God."

(1 Peter 3:18;)

In a crucified Christ we see the following:The love of God, the wisdom of God,
the justice of God and a perfect sacrifice in Jesus
who has made forgiveness possible.

Heb 2:9; "Should taste death." "A metaphor to express to die as a sacrifice, making satisfaction to divine justice, and expiating sins. Isa 53:10;

It is a metaphor allusive to the Grecian customs, who put men to death by giving them a cup of poison, as the Athenians executed Socrates."

"All his sufferings in body and soul, which were many and bitter, are here intended, and their completion by death."

Matt 26:39-42;

THE WAY OF SALVATION
The dilemma of mankind: SIN! Rom 6:23;
The wages of sin is spiritual separation from God.
All men have sinned. Rom 3:23;
Therefore all men stand under the penalty of death (without hope). Eph 2:12;

I am a sinner, big or little, I do not meet the standard that I was made to meet. I have gone wrong.

Because of sin I am cut off from a proper relationship with God, my maker. Salvation is all about getting back into a proper relationship of love and righteousness with God.

There is nothing I can do by myself to make myself right with God. God is a God of Righteousness, Justice, and Holiness. He is perfect & cannot simply overlook sin.



The need of mankind: SALVATION.

Salvation means deliverance from Great Danger.

Preservation: Saved from destruction.

Man is saved from:-

- a) Spiritual death. Eph 2:5;
- b) Condemnation. Rom 8:1;
- c) Eternal punishment. Matt 25:46;

QUESTION - Can a man be saved from something that does not exist?

If it does not exist then it presents no danger therefore salvation is not needed.



The errors of mankind: TWO EXTREMES OF MEN All Works.

All Works.

All Grace.

Man can be saved by his own works

Man can do nothing at all.

Salvation will depend on God's choice.

Justification by works - some modern attempts:
a) I will be saved if I live a good life,
do good and try my best.

- b) I will be saved if I go to church, pray, read my Bible, give to charity.
- c) I will be saved if I am sincere in what I believe.
 d) I will be saved if I go to the right church and believe the right things.

- e) I will be saved because I do not kill or rob,
 I try to be honest and live right.
 f) I am afraid of going hell,
 so I go to church to get me to heaven.
 - g) I go to church because it is my DUTY, If I don't do this I will not be saved.
- h) I go to the same church my mum went to, if it was good enough for her I will be OK.

Justification by "faith alone."

a) "you can do nothing, simply believe in the Lord

Jesus and you will be saved."

Is there a contradiction in that statement?

b) Some say "pray that the Lord Jesus will come into your heart tonight."

THE WAY OF SALVATION WHAT DOES THE BIBLE SAY?

a) Salvation is impossible to attain by relying on our own good works: Eph 2:8-9; Rom 3:28; 2 Tim 1:9;

Salvation is NOT by "faith alone."

Jam 2:14-26; Heb 5:8-9; Matt 7:21ff;

"So you see, it isn't enough just to have faith.

Faith that doesn't show itself by good deeds is no faith at all, it is dead and useless." Jam 2:17

"Now someone may argue, 'Some people have faith; others have good deeds.' I say, "I can't see your faith if you don't have good deeds, but I will show you my faith through my good deeds." Jam 2:18

What We Do Cannot Save Us / Not By Our Deeds. Forgiveness is not based on our good deeds no matter how many or how honourable they are.



Forgiveness is a free, unmerited gift from God and we accept it by faith.

Yet many try to earn their way to heaven.

They think that God will inspect their lives based on how well they did while on earth. God will either let them into heaven or banish them for eternity.

An inescapable conclusion comes from this line of thinking: If we are contributors to our own salvation, if our works can save us, then the death of Jesus was not only inadequate but unnecessary.

The apostle Paul put it this way:
"If righteousness could be gained through
the law, Christ died for nothing." Galatians 2:21;



Jesus came to set us free, to give us new life, not to supply us with a new set of rules and regulations to be obeyed in order to get to heaven.

The last thing we need is a religion based upon our performance; what we need is someone to give a perfect performance for us, and we find that performance accomplished in Jesus Christ.

The Word of God speaks clearly on this subject: It is by grace you have been saved, and this not from yourselves, it is a gift from God, not by works, so that no one can boast." Ephesians 2:8-9;

The Religion of the Pharisee. Jesus pointed out the folly of trying to earn one's way to heaven when he told the parable of the Pharisee and the publican. Luke 18:9-14;



The lesson was directed to "some who were confident of their own righteousness."

Two men went up to the temple to pray.

The Pharisee began his prayer by parading all his good deeds before God.

Pride filled his heart as he thanked God that he was not like those around him: robbers, evildoers, adulterers, or even the tax collectors who were notorious for dishonesty.

THE WAY OF SALVATION The Pharisee continued his prayer with a reminder to God that he fasted twice each week and gave 10 percent of his income to the Lord.



The publican also prayed, but in a different tone. He stood at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven, but in true repentance said, "God, have mercy on me, a sinner."

Which of these two people was forgiven?
It was the publican, Jesus said,
not the Pharisee, that found favour with God.

Why didn't the Pharisee find favour with God?

After all, he believed in God,

said his prayers and lived a good life.

THE WAY OF SALVATION
Where did he go wrong?
The problem with the Pharisee was that
he was trusting in the performance
of his religious duties to save him.



The Pharisee didn't believe he was sinless, but felt that his good deeds, which were many, would tip the scales of God's justice in his favour.

He thought the good deeds of his life would more than compensate for his failings, and he would surely get a favourable verdict. But he was wrong!

The Religious Treadmill

The religious practice of the Pharisee reminds us of two children playing on an escalator.

They were trying to go up the stairs that were coming down.

No matter how hard they tried, they failed: the stairs kept bringing them back to where they started.

Finally they got off and went over to the stairs that were moving upwards, stepped on, and let the stairs take them to the top.

How much more LOVE could Jesus show than to be punished for our sins and then allow His blood to wash them all away?

The question remains:

"How do we get our sins removed and receive eternal life?"



THE WAY OF SALVATION: Grace & Faith!

Grace & Faith at Pentecost.

Someone asks the question:
"At Pentecost, when asked

"what must we do?"

can you explain why Peter did not reply...

"Why, there is nothing you can do, it has already been done, just accept what we have told you and rely totally on the grace of God alone."

THE WAY OF SALVATION:- Grace & Faith!

These are not inquisitive students striving to understand the theories and mysteries of salvation.

They are desperate souls, deeply convinced of their sin against Jesus Himself, whom they just learned is Israel's resurrected Messiah and now ascended Lord. Acts 2:22-24,36;

They are ready and willing to do whatever Jesus commands, and Peter instructs them according to the Lord's own parting commission.

Luke 24:47; Matt. 28:19;

THE WAY OF SALVATION:- Grace & Faith!
The apostle commands the conscience-stricken
audience to make a spiritual u-turn on the inside
("repent") and to express that repentance
individually in a tangible, physical way
on the outside, ("be baptised.")

MAN'S PART IN SALVATION?


Although salvation comes by the grace of God and is available to all, there is a response man must make, otherwise all men would be saved no matter what they did, no matter what their attitudes were.

Jesus died for everyone's sins - for all the sins of every individual in the whole world. 1 John 2:2;
But not all people will be saved because many will NOT ACCEPT the TERMS of God's gift.

THE WAY OF SALVATION:- Grace & Faith!
In order to receive salvation,
we must respond in the way God requires!

Responding in the way God requires does not mean we earn salvation in any way by our response!

We must believe and know that God exists.
"Without faith it is impossible to please Him,
for He who comes to God must believe that He is,
and that He is a rewarder of those
who diligently seek Him." Hebrews 11:6;



THE WAY OF SALVATION:- Grace & Faith!

We must also believe that Jesus
is 'Immanuel: God with us',
who came to save us from our sins.

"Therefore I said to you that you will die in your sins; for if you do not believe that I am He, you will die in your sins." John 8:24;



THE WAY OF SALVATION:- Grace & Faith! Salvation is by the grace of God. Grace is goodwill or benevolence which is totally undeserved, unmerited favour, mercy.

We are saved by Grace, through faith, not of works. Eph 2:8-10; Tit 3:5; Acts 15:11;

Therefore salvation is on God's terms, not on ours.

God offers me salvation
as a FREE UNDESERVED GIFT.
He offers this gift NOT because I am worthy
but because He loves me.

THE WAY OF SALVATION: Grace & Faith.
I need to accept this gift for it to be mine.
God does not force it on me.
I accept it by trust (faith), which leads to obedience.
(Doing what God says I need to do.)

The result?

The Christian life is lived as a love response to God's great gift.

Our continued obedience and good works are done not in order to save us, but because we are already saved. Not out of duty or fear, but out of thankfulness and love.

NOT BECAUSE WE HAVE TO! BUT BECAUSE WE WANT TO! THE WAY OF SALVATION: Grace & Faith. Repentance, Confession and Baptism is our faith response to God's Grace. **Baptism** in response to the gospel

is a specific act of submission and surrender to the crucified and risen Messiah.

("into the name of [relationship with] Jesus Christ.")

Because Pentecost marks the beginning of the "last days" God will fulfill His ancient promise to save and to give His Spirit, (His personal, powerful Presence) to everyone who calls on the Lord.

All those whom God calls to Himself.

(Acts 2:38; Joel 2:28-32; 2Thess 2:14;)

These truths are not limited to the Pentecost audience, or even to Jewish people, but are applicable to men and women from all nations throughout the gospel era. (Acts 2:39;)

It is right to remember that baptism does not cause God to love us. Baptism does not make us merit salvation or earn God's forgiveness. It is not a 'work' we do that sets us right with God.

That work was fully accomplished by Jesus of Nazareth before we ever heard of it. JESUS PAID THE PRICE!

THE WAY OF SALVATION - Grace & Faith
Only BECAUSE Jesus finished that saving work,
which both demonstrated and justified God's love
for sinners, can anyone "repent and be baptised
in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness
of sins." using Peter's very words of instruction
to his Pentecost audience. (Acts 2:38;)

There is no conflict between grace on the one hand, and faith, repentance and baptism on the other hand.

As long as those who respond in faith, repentance and are baptised, do so trusting God's grace as shown in Jesus Christ.

Though faith is not identical with knowledge, it is by no means devoid of knowledge. Faith does not operate in a vacuum.

To be saved one must believe some basic information.

Proclaiming the gospel includes more than imparting information, but by no means less.

There is a basic content to the gospel, which includes information about God, man, the person and work of Christ, and how His benefits are appropriated, which we must have some awareness of in order to exercise saving faith.

There is an aspect of faith which refers to intellectual assent to the truth of the data or content of the gospel.

To believe that Maggie Thatcher was a Prime Minister of England means that we affirm the truth of that proposition.

We cannot have saving faith if we do not believe that the gospel is true.

I cannot "decide" to believe something if my mind is not convinced that it is true.

I can "hope" that something questionable is true and act according to that hope.

What I cannot do is actually be convinced of a truth by a mere decision. "Faith" without genuine assent is no more than credulity or superstition.

Saving faith involves personal trust.

This is usually understood as involving something in addition to the cognitive or purely intellectual element.

It involves the volitional and affective elements of human response.

It involves our repentance a change in us which change includes a change in affection, disposition, inclination, and volition.

We now choose Christ. We embrace Christ. We want to follow Christ, we flee to Christ.

THE WAY OF SALVATION - Grace & Faith Real Faith in Jesus.

"And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to Him must believe that He exists and that He rewards those who earnestly seek him." Hebrews 11:6;

"You are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus, for all of you who were baptised into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ."

Galatians 3:26-27;




"What is more, I consider everything a loss compared to the surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things."

Faith Responds in Obedience!

Faith is essential if we are to be right with God.

But what does faith mean?

Faith means to trust, to believe, and in

Abraham we have a model for that type of faith.

His life is punctuated with demonstrations of faith, trust, belief in God. He was told by God to leave his home and go to a foreign land.

"By faith Abraham, when called to go to a place he would later receive as his inheritance, obeyed and went, even though he did not know where he was going." Hebrews 11:8; That's faith!



THE WAY OF SALVATION - Grace & Faith Faith Believes the Impossible! God promised Abraham a son.

Time passed and the promise remained unfulfilled.

Abraham was now 99 years old and his wife

Sarah was 90. God spoke again to him

about the promise of a son.

Though surrounded by physical impossibilities, Abraham had faith that what God said would indeed come to pass.

And when his son Isaac was born and was grown, Abraham was commanded to offer Isaac as a sacrifice.



"By faith Abraham, when God tested him, offered Isaac as a sacrifice."

Hebrews 11:17;



God never allowed Abraham to take the young boy's life, though Abraham showed he was prepared to do so, and for this reason Abraham is called "God's friend." James 2:23; That's faith!

The type of faith Abraham displayed is the kind of faith that WE are to have.


A faith that BELIEVES in God!

Our first step to becoming reconciled to God begins with our belief in God and in Jesus His son. At some point in our past, we began hearing about Jesus Christ, the son of God.

We might have heard it from a preacher, from our parents, maybe from our husband or wife, or we may have started studying the Bible on our own and eventually came to know the Truth.

In any case, our belief begins to develop when we began to hear about Jesus Christ. In Romans 10:17, we are taught that faith in God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit comes by "hearing the Word of God."

When our belief begins to develop, it begins to lead us in the direction of a greater understanding of who God is which will lead us to subsequent changes in our life.

For instance, when we began studying the Bible we probably learned...

...that through belief in Jesus
we would not be condemned. John 3:18;
That through belief in Jesus
we could have everlasting life. John 3:36;

That through belief, we could have everlasting life through the name of Jesus. John 20:31;

That through belief, we would be able to overcome the world and all of its sinful temptations.

1 John 5:4-5;

That without belief, it would be lmpossible to please God.

Hebrews 11:6

As our study progressed, we undoubtedly saw many great examples of those who believed in God.

For instance, consider the example of the Eunuch.

Here was a man who, being taught
the gospel by Philip, believed and obeyed
the teachings of Jesus Christ. Acts 8:36-37;

We may have also learned of the example set by Saul, (who was later called Paul). Saul was a man who, upon learning the Truth, had enough faith in Jesus Christ to repent, to turn himself to do what Jesus asked of him. Acts 9:8-11,18;

Although this turning resulted in his being rejected by many of his peers, this turning resulted in Saul's salvation through his faith in Jesus Christ.

Or the wonderful example of the faith of the Philippian Jailer. Acts 16:30-33;

Perhaps having developed a strong belief in Jesus Christ through the Word of God, we may develop a desire and zeal to do whatever Jesus Christ, the Son of God, asks us to do.

We may begin to have a growing desire to follow Him whom we had rejected for so long.

The purpose of our belief is to point us in the right direction. Our belief, which was based upon the Word of God, pointed us in the direction of obedience to God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit, and away from sin and worldliness.

Now because of our growing faith the next thing we will want to do is to repent of our sins.

Jesus made it clear that "unless we repent, we shall all likewise perish." Luke 13:3;

What does the word repent mean?
There are several parts to the definition of this word.
To begin with, we must understand what sin is.

The Bible has about 21 lists to help us identify sin in both attitudes and actions.

We must recognize what sin does to us. It separates us from the fellowship of God and condemns us to eternal consequences.

Sin also caused the innocent Jesus to be crucified; He had to shed His blood to pay the price of our sins to redeem us back to God.

Thinking about these truths should help us to understand that sin has consequences and that all those things we have said and done that have hurt ourselves and others Had an impact greater than we can imagine.

This should cause us to feel sorrow for what we have done.

That feeling of sorrow is not repentance, but it can lead to or bring about repentance.

Repentance is a word that has strayed far from its original meaning.

Being sorry for sin and promising never to do it again is the standard understanding most people have about repentance, but this is quite different from how the Bible defines it.

For example, a person can spend an evening consuming alcohol. The next morning, with head throbbing and nerves jumping, he stumbles toward the medicine cabinet vowing, "Never again. I'll never touch another drop as long as I live."

THE WAY OF SALVATION - Grace & Repentance!

What he has expressed is remorse or regret,
but is NOT Godly repentance.

The scripture says this about repentance:-

"Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret, but worldly sorrow brings death." 2 Cor 7:10;

Having Godly sorrow means that we see our sins as having offended God and for that we are genuinely sorrowful.

By repenting we make a conscious decision to turn away from sin and to turn our life over to God.

THE WAY OF SALVATION - Grace & Repentance!
An example of Repentance: Zacchaeus
was a wealthy tax collector who heard about Jesus.
Anxious to see Jesus, but prevented because of
his small size, Zacchaeus climbed a sycamore tree
in order to see Jesus as He passed by.

Zacchaeus' encounter with Jesus moved his heart to repentance. "Here and now," he said, "I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything I will pay back four times the amount."

That is Godly repentance. Because of his penitent heart and faith in Jesus, the Lord said to Zacchaeus, "Today salvation has come to this house." Luke 19:1-10;

The call to repentance is a recurring theme in the scriptures. John the Baptiser insisted that his disciples "produce fruit in keeping with repentance."

Matthew 3:8;

John wanted the people not only to believe in Jesus the Messiah, but to demonstrate that they had turned their lives away from sin by displaying the evidence of true repentance.

Genuine sorrow over our sins will cause us to change our way of thinking and our actions, And cause us to also ask 'What we have to do?'

John, who prepared the way for Jesus, told the people to "bear fruits worthy of repentance." Matt 3:6;

THE WAY OF SALVATION - Grace & Repentance!
In other words, there must be a change
in the way we think, act and live.

"Truly, these times of ignorance God overlooked, but now commands all men everywhere to repent, because He has appointed a day on which He will judge the world in righteousness by the Man whom He has ordained. He has given assurance of this to all by raising Him from the dead." Acts 17:30-31;

"For the grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men, teaching us that denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly in this present age."

Titus 2:11-12;

Jesus commanded that "repentance and forgiveness of sins... be preached in His name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem." Luke 24:47;


Peter told his audience that they were to "repent and be baptized" Later he told others, "Repent then, and turn to God."

Acts 2:38; 3:19;

Repentance MUST NOT be thought of only in negative terms: We must stop committing sins. It is much more than that.

The positive side of repentance is that we decide to change the direction of our spiritual lives and turn to follow God. That is true godly repentance!

The Need to Repent! "This is what is written:
The Christ will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and repentance and forgiveness of sins will be preached in His name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem." Luke 24:46-47;


Repentance figured prominently in the ministries of our Lord Jesus Christ,

John the Baptiser, and the apostles.

And today we must be faithful in calling people to repentance.

Peter replied, "Repent and be immersed, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." Acts 2:38;

"I have declared to both Jews and Greeks that they must turn to God in repentance and have faith in our Lord Jesus." Acts 20:21;



In Peter's reply, we notice that he stated first and foremost the need for the people to repent of their sins. We need to do this too after we had established our belief in Jesus Christ.

We will want to repent of our sins because of what we had learned about God's grace.

From our studies of God's Word.
We learned that God loves us! John 3:16-17;
We learned that Jesus Died for us! Rom 5:8;

We learned that repentance was commanded by Jesus Christ and by God. Luke 13:3; Acts 17:30; We learned that repentance leads to our obedience in baptism for the forgiveness of our sins. Acts 2:38;

That repentance leads us to have our sins blotted out. Acts 3:19; That repentance would help to bring about our salvation.

2 Corinthians 7:10;

That our repentance would cause great joy in Heaven.

Luke 15:7;

When we commit ourselves to repentance, what does that mean?
When we commit ourselves to repentance, we commit ourselves to changing our life, our actions, and attitudes.

Repenting of our sins is much more than walking down front and saying, "I am sorry."

True repentance begins with the desire to STOP SINNING and START SERVING the Lord. It requires changes in our life.

The purpose of our repentance is to turn us away from sin and turn us to a life of service unto God.

Now if we are Christians, it is crucial that we strive to keep our back turned to sin.

If we learn that some practice in our life is wrong, then our repentant heart ought to drive us, with God's help, to begin working to overcome that sin.

With a truly repentant heart, we will strive to overcome the sin that existed within our lives prior to our being saved.

Not only because we have to, but because we want to!

Because our repentance often brings such a dramatic change in our attitudes and actions especially towards our awareness of God and our willingness to begin to serve God. Many believe and teach that this outward change of our life in attitude and action means that we must be saved at that point.

But a changed life is not proof of our salvation because our salvation is based on God's terms not on ours.

A friend of mine who was an atheist came in to work one day and said he had decided to quit smoking and he did – that day – he never smoked again.

I know many people who do not believe in God who have changed their lives and attitudes for one reason or another.

They still do not have salvation!

I know many people who in many ways live better lives than many Christians. They are nice, polite, helpful, encouraging, yet they do not believe in Jesus.

Having a Christian attitude and disposition does not make a person a Christian. We need to accept the grace of God through the blood of Jesus on God's terms, not ours.

The change in a persons attitude and life brought about by repentance means a change in the right direction but does not remove our sins.

Let's use as an example a mountain-climbing trip: We decide to climb a mountain.

We load up our backpack with all the things that we need to achieve our aim, including an oxygen tank. It is quite a load to carry!

We manage to reach quite high on the mountain when we see a furious storm develop and realize that if we do not turn back now we will be in serious trouble.

We turn back (repent), make our way down to base camp. At base camp we take our backpack off change into clean clothes have a good sleep.

We waken up next morning to a brand new day.

A Sherpa picks up our backpack and walks off ahead with it, leaving you to walk unencumbered, to enjoy the view and the walk home.


No example is perfect but if we imagine that as we climb through life achieving various goals. we collect a lot of sins along the way, filling our backpack with wrong living and guilt.

Then we hear about God, we read His word and read about His Grace, we realize that we are in trouble, and we decide to turn back (repent) to God.

As we change our direction and make our way back to God changing some of our old habits, attitudes, and actions...

...we are still carrying our back pack, our load of past sin and guilt!

Only Jesus blood can wash away our sin but we have not got that far on our journey towards salvation yet.




THE WAY OF SALVATION - Grace & Repentance!

We have found God's grace, responded by faith, and repentance, but is there more we still have to do in response to God's grace in order to be cleansed from our sins?

If after you repented you never committed another sin in your life you would still be carrying the burden of your past sins.

While our repentance / change / affects many areas of our life, the first act of our repentant heart means that we ought to make our belief known through obedience to the teachings of Jesus.



THE WAY OF SALVATION - Grace & Confession!
In other words, we ought to confess
our belief in Jesus Christ.

If we are ready to change the way we live, (doing God's will instead of our own), then we should be ready to confess before men that Jesus is the Son of God.

Matthew 10:32-33; Acts 8:37; 1 Timothy 6:12;

Confession might involve us standing in front of some people and saying "Yes" to the question.

"Do you believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God?"

However, our confession actually begins when we decide to act upon our belief in Jesus Christ and does not end with our baptism.

The confession of our belief in Jesus begins because we want to be saved from our sins and continues after we are saved.

Consider the example of one who confessed his belief in Jesus Christ prior to his being immersed.

In Acts 8:26-39; we learn about the conversion of the eunuch. Beginning in verse 31, we see Philip beginning to teach the Eunuch about Jesus Christ.

When Philip and the Eunuch came to some water, the Eunuch, based upon Philip's teachings regarding Jesus Christ, asked, "See, here is water. What hinders me from being immersed?" v. 36;

Philip replied, "If you believe with all your heart, you may. To that, the Eunuch replied, "I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God." v. 37;

After hearing the Eunuch's confession of his belief in Jesus, Philip took him down into the water and baptized him.

Acts 8:38-39;

What we see with the Eunuch is a natural step following one's belief and repentant heart to be willing to confess your belief in Jesus Christ and be buried with Him in baptism.

How was Philip to know that the eunuch was ready to be baptized if the eunuch had not told him that he believed? When the Eunuch stated his belief in Jesus Christ, he was simply confirming his belief in Jesus Christ.

The Eunuch's actions were in line with the teachings of the inspired teachers, such as The apostle Paul who wrote in Romans 10:9-10;

"That if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved, for with the heart man believes to righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made to salvation." Romans 10:9-10;.

If we include Rom 10:17; We have Hearing, believing and confession of belief in Jesus all combined in this passage.

Is it possible for a person to confess his/her belief in other ways?

Most certainly! Every time a person takes a stand for the Truth and overcomes sin, he/she is showing his/her belief in Jesus Christ.

THE WAY OF SALVATION - Grace & Confession! In Acts 2:38; we see Peter saying nothing about belief or confession.

Are we to conclude that the three thousand people who were saved on the day of Pentecost did not confess their belief in Jesus Christ? Certainly not.

The fact that they asked the question, "Men and brethren, what shall we do?" revealed their belief in Jesus Christ.

When they repented and were baptized, they were acting upon their obvious belief in Jesus Christ.

When we decide to become a child of God, we take the step of confessing our belief in Jesus Christ. This step may be in specific words and / or in our obedience to Jesus' command to be baptized.

THE WAY OF SALVATION - Grace & Confession!

Our confession at that point should set the precedence for the rest of our life.

We must continue to confess Jesus Christ before men. Here are some of the benefits of confessing our belief in Jesus Christ.

By confessing our belief,
Jesus will confess us before His Father in Heaven.

Matthew 10:32;

However, the reverse is just as true.

If we fail to confess our belief in Jesus,
then He will deny us to His Father. Matthew 10:33;

If we will continue to confess Jesus Christ before men, then God will continue to dwell in us.

1 John 4:14-15;

If we were to walk away from the Lord now, ceasing to confess our belief in Him.

We need to understand that a day will come when all will confess the name of Jesus Christ.

However, at that point, our confession will come too late to satisfy the needs of our soul.

Romans 14:11; Philippians 2:11;

The purpose of our confession is to set a precedent for the remainder of our life.

We must strive to never fail in SHOWING our FAITH in Jesus Christ.

Not because we have to but because we want to!

We must strive to show our faith in Jesus Christ, whether it is in word or in action. "And whatever you do or say, let it be as a representative of the Lord Jesus, and come with him into the presence of God the Father to give Him your thanks."

Colossians 3:17;

A Christian is the perfect person to confess the name of Jesus Christ.

People will read our lives before they read the Bible They will be looking at us before they look at God.

Biblical Baptism?

God has provided us a Saviour in Jesus Christ.

Through His grace He offers us the pardon or forgiveness of our sins. And that gift of forgiveness cannot be earned by anything we do.

Our faith must be in the perfect sacrifice which Jesus offered to the Father for our sins.

When Peter preached the gospel on Pentecost, the Holy Spirit convicted people of their sinful condition and their need for forgiveness.

They cried out to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?"

Peter said to them, "Repent and be immersed, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins.

And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."

Those who were immersed had their faith in the sacrifice of Jesus for their forgiveness.

They did not trust in themselves or in what they were doing, but trusted in what Jesus had done on their behalf.

Faith and baptism are combined in Mark 16:16; in which Jesus said, "He who believes and is baptised will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned."



Notice that salvation occurs after a person both believes and is baptised. It is not a matter of doing one or the other; both are necessary before sins can be washed away.

The New Testament book of Acts contains several accounts of people being saved from their sins as the gospel spread into the entire world.

The very first gospel sermon was preached on the day of Pentecost after Jesus had ascended into heaven.

Acts 1:9-11;

After the Holy Spirit came upon the apostles.

Acts 2:1-4;

Their faith was not in a sacrament, but in a Saviour. From Pentecost onward, the church proclaimed forgiveness of sins in the name of Jesus Christ.

Those who believed that message were baptised in [into] His name.
"But when they [the Samaritans] believed Philip as he preached the good news of the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, they were immersed, both men and women." Acts 8:12;

"And many of the Corinthians who heard him believed and were immersed."

Acts 18:8;

Even the apostle Paul "And now what are you waiting for? Get up, be baptised and wash your sins away, calling on His name." Acts 22:16;

In immersion, we are being identified through our faith with Jesus Christ in His death, burial and resurrection.

In our immersion, we contact the BLOOD of Christ and through that blood we receive the forgiveness of our sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit.

In our immersion, we are making a distinctive break with the world and our former manner of life and committing ourselves unto Jesus as the Lord of our lives.

The solution to the problem of sin is the same today.

Anyone who wants to be forgiven of sins must repent and be immersed.

It is not the water that cleanses us.


Jesus washes away our sins
in His own blood. Revelation 1:5;
He washes our sins away
when we are baptized
into a relationship with Him.
Matt 28:19-20; Acts 22:16; Gal 3:26-29;

At our baptism and through it our contact with the blood of Christ, God "counts" or "reckons" us JUST by legally transferring the righteousness of Christ to our account.


This involves
the transfer of Christ's merit to us.
Christ's righteousness
is assigned to us and is counted for us.

THE WAY OF SALVATION. – Grace & Baptism.

Our redemption is grounded in a double imputation by which our sins are transferred to Christ in the atonement and His righteousness is transferred to us. We can illustrate this double transfer by the following chart:-



The three circles in Figure 1 show God's circle having no marks inside of it, representing His purity without blemish. The circle representing Jesus likewise has no black marks within it, representing his sinlessness and perfect obedience, his perfect merit. The circle representing man is shaded black, representing the radical pollution of sin in our lives.



In Figure 2 we see the change in the circle of Jesus in that now His circle is covered by sin.

The arrow from man's circle to Jesus' circle illustrates that the sin of man is transferred to Jesus.

This is what takes place on the cross. In the atonement, God lays upon Jesus our sins. Jesus is the Lamb without blemish who receives our blemishes by imputation.

He is our substitute, so that God pours out the wrath of His judgment on Christ who vicariously accepts the imputation of our guilt and sin.

On the cross Jesus
was just in Himself and sinner by imputation.
When Scripture speaks of Jesus becoming sin
for us, it does not mean that He became in Himself
a sinner. If that were the case, He would not
have been worthy to save himself, let alone us.

On the cross Christ paid the price for our sin. This was both a work of expiation and propitiation.

By expiation He "took away" our sins from us. By propitiation He satisfied the justice of God by undergoing the penalty for our guilt.


The imputed righteousness for man that was brought about by this sacrifice was not automatic or all men would be saved we needed to respond to this sacrifice on our behalf.

To have our sins punished for us in Christ is to leave us now innocent in the sight of God.

Salvation requires more than innocence.

It demands positive obedience to the Law of God.

This is why what is required is not merely a single imputation but a double imputation.



In Figure 3 we see that the circle of man is now clean and righteous.

The lower arrow pointing from Jesus to man represents the transfer of the righteousness and merit of Jesus to us.

In justification not only are our sins imputed to Jesus by God, but His righteousness is imputed to us. By imputation we possess the righteousness of Jesus in the sight of God.

We are now acceptable to God not because we are righteous but because we have accepted the righteousness of Christ through the way that God has asked us to:-

Through our acceptance of the proclamation of the gospel by faith.

This is not faith alone it involves all that is involved in mans response to the gospel.

Why does God wait until our baptism to justify and save us?

Part of the reason is that Jesus has given us a commandment; Are we willing to obey it? Matt 28:18-20;

"There is also an antitype which now saves us, Namely immersion (not the removal of the filth of the flesh, but the answer of a good conscience toward God,) through the resurrection of Jesus."

1 Peter 3:21;

Baptism is similar to marriage. A couple begin dating, fall in love and plan to marry. In their vows, they commit themselves to each other for life.

God then joins them together in this new relationship of husband and wife.

Likewise, baptism marks the beginning of a new relationship with God.




To have the hope of eternal life:


To have the hope of eternal life:

THE WAY OF SALVATION. Only Two Possibilities on Receiving Forgiveness of Sins.

SALVATION IS UNCONDITIONAL.

If true: God saves everybody. Romans 2:6-8;
OR He arbitrarily saves some and condemns others.

Acts 10:34-35;

SALVATION IS CONDITIONAL

If true: God saves those who trust in His grace and accept His terms for salvation. Hebrews 5:8-9;

"Although He was a Son, He learned obedience from the things which He suffered. And having been made perfect, He became to ALL THOSE who OBEY Him the source of eternal salvation."

THE WAY OF SALVATION. HOW DOES ONE BECOME A CHRISTIAN?

Agrippa answered, "In short, you are doing your best to persuade me to become a Christian."

Matt 26:28:

We need to hear about God's grace revealed in the death burial and resurrection of Jesus. Hearing the gospel, responding to the truth of the gospel, obedience to the faith, doctrine.

We have dug a hole too deep for us to get out of by ourselves.

God's Justice (the need to condemn sin.)
God's Mercy (God's desire to save us.)
Is met in the sacrifice of Jesus,
His death burial and resurrection.

We call this God's GRACE!
Without the Grace of God we would be lost forever because of our sin.

We need to understand that we are sinners. We need to understand that despite our sin God loves us.

We need to hear the gospel!

(the good news)

that Jesus died for us,
Jesus died in our place.

"So faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes through the word of Christ."

Rom 10:17;

"Brothers, I am telling you the Good News which I've already told you. You accepted it and you are still staying with it. If you hold onto the Good News which I told you, then, through it, you are being saved, unless you believed it for nothing!" 1 Cor 15:1-4

"First of all, I passed on to you the same thing which was passed on to me: Christ died for our sins. (The Scriptures told about this before it happened.) He was buried and he was raised from death on the third day. (The Scriptures foretold this, too.)"

Faith is our RESPONSE to hearing the gospel, the good news, it means we truly believe that Jesus is the Son of God, who died for our sins.

"That is why I said that you will die in your sins; for UNLESS you believe that I am who I say I am, you will die in your sins." John 8:24;

"You can never please God without faith, without depending on him. Anyone who wants to come to God must believe that there is a God and that He rewards those who sincerely look for Him."

Heb 11:6;

Repentance is faith in action, a response to our believing the gospel and that God wants to save us through the blood of His son. It means a change of will and attitude, a change of direction away from our old way of life and past sins.

"Those times of ignorance God viewed with indulgence. But now He commands all men everywhere to repent." Acts 17:30;

"First, in Damascus, I began to tell Jews that they should change their hearts. I told them to turn back to God. I also went to Jerusalem and to the area around Judea and I said, Change your lives and do things. This will show that you have truly changed your hearts." Acts 26:19-20;

"Since we have these promises, beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from every defilement of body and of spirit, making holiness perfect in the fear of God." 2 Cor 7:10;

Confession of our faith, our belief in Jesus dying in our place is again our faith in action Making public acknowledgment of our belief.

"If you confess with your mouth that "Jesus is Lord" and if you believe in your heart that God raised Jesus from death, you will be saved." Rom 10:9-10;

"Keep contending in the noble contest of the faith; seize hold on eternal life, to which you were called when you confessed the good confession in the presence of many witnesses." 1Tim 6:13;

"Many people, even some of the leaders, believed in Jesus.

But they would not say that they believed,
because they were afraid of the Pharisees. They didn't
want to be thrown out of the synagogues." John 12:42;

THE WAY OF SALVATION. Baptism, Immersion in water in the name of Jesus Christ is again our faith in action this time resulting in THE FORGIVENESS OF OUR PAST SINS!

"Then Peter answered, "Change your hearts and each one of you must be immersed by the authority of Jesus the Messiah, so that your sins may be forgiven. Then you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." Acts 2:38;

"Now, don't wait any longer. Rise up, get yourself immersed and get your sins washed away, trusting in His name." Acts 22:16;

"You were buried with Christ by immersion. You were also raised with Christ through believing in the power of God who raised Christ from death." Col 2:12;

Becoming a Christian is the same as:Becoming a disciple Acts 11:26;

"When he found Saul, Barnabas brought him to Antioch. Saul and Barnabas taught a large crowd. For a whole year they met with the congregation. In Antioch, God called the disciples "Christians" for the first time.

Becoming a member of the Lord's body the church.

1 Corinthians 12:12-13;

"The body is a unit, but it has many parts.

All of the many parts of the body make up one body.

Christ is the same way."



Why become a follower of Jesus? Jesus is KING we are His SUBJECTS.


All these relationships are positive not negative.



The Gospel re-enacted. Through the blood of Christ our baptism brings us into a relationship with God.

You see all three elements of the Gospel are represented in baptism: Jesus' death vs our death to self, Jesus' burial vs our burial in the watery grave of baptism, Jesus' resurrection vs our being raised up to live a new life.

"I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting," he replied. 6 "Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do "





What happens at the point of Baptism?

Rom 6:3-4;



We are placed "into Christ." (1 Cor 12:13; Gal 3:27;)
We're associated with the death of Christ. (Col 2:12;)
We receive the forgiveness of our sins. (Acts 2:38;)
We are raised to a new life. (2 Cor 5:17; Col 2:12;)
We receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. (Acts 2:38;)

"Then Peter said to them, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."

Is Baptism an OPTION or a COMMAND?

Men can deny many things, but will never erase from the Bible the fact that if a person wants to be a Christian, baptism is a COMMAND of JESUS therefore ESSENTIAL.

Matthew 28:19; Mark 16:15-16;

Acts 2:37-41; 8:12; 8:35-38; 22:16;

Romans 6:1-6; 10:14-17; 1 Corinthians 1:13-17; etc.

There is no need to argue with God.
What is the problem with men today?
Why is it that they love to contradict the will of God?

We will not be baptised if we do not believe it necessary and commanded by Jesus Christ.

It is important to note that baptism ALONE does not save us.

To say that baptism alone saves us would be like saying that faith alone saves us or that repentance alone saves us.

NEITHER would be what God says in His word.

Our obedience to Jesus' command to be baptised works WITH our belief, WITH our repentant change AND WITH the confession of our faith to save us.

THE WAY OF SALVATION - Summary God's terms of grace.

THE WAY OF SALVATION- Summary

The purpose of God's grace: To offer us a way of escape from the ultimate consequences of our sins and help us back to a relationship with our God.

The purpose of our belief: To direct us to faithful obedience to God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit.

The purpose of our repentance:

To turn us to Jesus Christ and His teachings, turning away from our sinful activities of the past and stay away from them in the future.

The purpose of our confession:

To show that we believe in God and Jesus Christ and are not ashamed of our belief.

The purpose of baptism: to allow the blood of Christ to wash away the sins of our past life, to be saved, to receive the gift of the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. 1 Peter 3:21; Revelation 1:5;

It is at the point of baptism that God cleanses us from our sins by the blood of Jesus and adds us to the body of Christ, the church.

It is that from which we rise to walk in a new life, serving God, living faithfully until our bodily death, and granting us everlasting life with God.

When we look at the religious world today there seems to be so many conflicting answers to questions and so much confusion.

THE WORK OF THE HOLY SPIRIT
