

Christians are those who have been saved by the grace of God through the blood of Christ accepted through their faithful obedience to this gospel of Christ.

Grace is the gift of God to man demonstrated in the giving of His son as the only acceptable sacrifice for sin.

Through Jesus death burial and resurrection and specifically the shed blood of Jesus man has the opportunity of being redeemed back to God.

The historical book of Acts traces the impact of Gods grace on the life of people in the first century

As Jesus was lifted up as king and redeemer by the proclamation of the good news of the kingship of the risen Christ.

We see mans response to the good news and the way that thousands accepted the offer of salvation that was available through the blood of Jesus.

The gift of Gods Grace through the death burial and resurrection of Jesus opened the door for us to have our sins forgiven and to receive the indwelling gift of the Holy Spirit and walk a new way of life in Christ Jesus.

The same offer of salvation through the blood of Jesus is available today in the same way as it was made available so long ago. We need to respond in the same way to be born again to a living hope.





HAVE YOU BEEN BAPTIZED INTO CHRIST?

What about the Thief on the Cross-Kingdom. Lord, remember me when you come into your kingdom.

The Thief died UNDER THE OLD COVENANT the Kingdom had not been established it was still future. "Now those who had come together began to ask Him, "Lord, IS THIS the time WHEN you WILL restore the kingdom to Israel?" Act 1:6;

Even at this time the Apostles did not understand that Jesus new kingdom/covenant /agreement was a spiritual one not a physical one but what ever they were waiting for they knew it was still future.

What about the Thief on the Cross?

"I tell you that you are Peter, and it is on this rock (The statement that Jesus was the Christ) I will build my church, and the powers of hell will not conquer it. 19 I will give you the keys to the kingdom (keys preach the gospel began Acts 2) of heaven.

"Whatever you prohibit on earth will have been prohibited in heaven, and whatever you permit on earth will have been permitted in heaven."

Matt 16:16-19; (The gospels ability to forgive sins and teach what Christ wants us to know.)

What about the Thief on the Cross?

"Then he said to them, Truly I tell you, some people standing here will not experience death until they see the kingdom of God arrive with power." Mark 9:1;

(Will happen in their lifetime.)

Luke 24:45; "Then he opened their minds so that they might come to understand the Scriptures. 46 He said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ was to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day,"


- "47 and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed IN HIS NAME to all the nations, BEGINNING at Jerusalem."
- 48 "You are witnesses of these things. 49 I am sending on you what my Father promised. (Holy Spirit) But stay here in the city (Jerusalem) until you have been clothed with power from on high." (Power came in Acts 2:1-4; / Gospel preached for first time. Acts 2;)

What about the Thief on the Cross?

Col 1:13; "He has rescued us from the power of darkness and has brought us INTO the kingdom of the Son whom he loves." (They are now in the Kingdom.)

- Col 1:14; "In Him we have redemption,
 the forgiveness of sins."
 (Christians were in the spiritual Kingdom. the church
 the family of God in the first century after Christ
 resurrection and gospel is preached. Acts 2;)
 - The Thief was promised to be with Jesus in Paradise not on earth, he never saw the kingdom that Jesus set up on earth he was taken into Paradise before Christ's Ascension in Acts 1. He has nothing to do with how we are saved today.
