

PURPOSE OF THIS LESSON.

To give a brief summary of mankind from the very creation, showing how men have continually left God and His divine will and in doing so have brought upon themselves misery and heartaches.

To show also how men in our Christian Era left God's New Testament truth which has resulted in the doctrines of men and religious strife and divisions.

PURPOSE OF THIS LESSON. To assure the believer that religious unity is possible through the Grace of God.

The grace of God is demonstrated through the death burial and resurrection of Jesus.

As we respond to the grace of God by our faithful obedience to the gospel of Jesus. 1 Cor 15:1-6; Matt 28:19-20; Acts 2:36-38;

God adds us to His family, Christ's body, the church, the kingdom of God.

Which is founded upon
Christ and His Holy Word. Eph 4:1-6;

SYNOPSIS.

Beginning with Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden, the story of man's departures from God is revealed.

When Jesus established His church, we see the same principle involved for some Christians departed from the faith.

This resulted in the gradual development of the Roman State Church or Catholicism in the Sixth Century and later, divided into Protestantism in the Sixteenth Century.

Our lesson ends with the plea to return to the family of God (all those called out by God through the gospel) as revealed in the first century.

A plea for all throughout the world to return to God's Way as revealed in the New Testament.
In this way all may be one in Christ Jesus.

Many weary hours could be spent in investigating the numerous denominations, sects, philosophies and isms which are offered in the name of Christianity.

Some suggest that there are as many as 20 thousand different groups all claiming to be the one true Church.

Numerous differing religious systems are offered in the NAME of Christianity.

The more people search, the more confused they become. Haven't you found it totally refreshing just to study the Bible itself? It is the only divinely inspired source of God's truth.

Many conflicting answers have been given by men to the question. "What must I do to be saved?" But the one and only sure answer to this question is revealed by Jesus in the New Testament.

Jesus has said.
"no man comes unto the Father but by me."
(John 14:6;) Acts 4:12;

Comparing one religious group with another will not tell us about CHRIST'S CHURCH but instead will cause only confusion and misunderstanding.

Since all of today's religious groups came into existence centuries after Jesus established HIS CHURCH, when and how did they come into being?

This interesting lesson will help answer some of these questions.

In part four in this series we saw:"God's Plan for Redeeming Man."
This showed that for man to pass from the sentence of spiritual death to eternal life.

God has provided and revealed His way to redeem man from sin through the sacrifice of Jesus.

Without this Sacrifice the whole world would be lost without hope.

Since the Supreme Sacrifice to save mankind has been made, everyone who remains lost can only blame themselves. Acts 4:11; Hebrews 2:3;

"History of the Lord's New Covenant People." THE SPIRITUAL BODY OF CHRIST began on the first Jewish Day of Pentecost after the cross.

The History Leading up to
The Lord's Reign over His New Family
From Adam to Pentecost.

Through succeeding centuries various religious movements have arisen within the context of THE CHURCH and her influence.

This lesson presents an overview of these events.

The Church, the Family, The Kingdom.

Church historians must take into account the fact that man often departs from God's way.



From the very beginning of time, the history of religion has demonstrated over and over:-

That only a small minority Remain faithful to God's way.

It was not very long after Adam and Eve were created before they departed from God's way.



The heavenly Father had appointed Adam to rule over the earth and all living creatures.

God had placed the first pair in the Garden of Eden where they could have enjoyed its beauty and provisions forever.

But Adam and Eve left God's way by choosing to listen to the Devil and eat the one fruit that God had forbidden. Genesis 2:8; to 3:27;

ADAM AND EVE could not hide their disobedience from God.



Since they chose to sin, they forfeited their home in the garden And access to the tree of life and began to die physically.

But worst of all, being separated from God, Having lost their relationship they died spiritually.

It is important to remember that Adam and Eve lost these precious blessing because they departed from God's way.

Genesis 3:8-11; Isaiah 59:1-2;

IN HIS BOUNDLESS LOVE God soon provided avenues of worship through which man, now separated from God, could draw near to Him again.

But Cain, a son of Adam and Eve, again demonstrated that man often departs from God's way.



In the Book of Hebrews
"By faith, Abel offered God
a better sacrifice than Cain did.
Abel was a good man, through faith.
God was pleased with his gifts.

Cain offered a sacrifice which was displeasing to God.


As the earth became more populated, most of the people followed the way of Cain.

They continued to disregard God and His Word.

Genesis 4:3-8;

BY THE TIME OF NOAH practically all the world had strayed from God's way.

Mankind had become so corrupt that God determined to destroy them by bringing a flood of water upon the earth.



God revealed His plan to Noah and told him how to construct a huge boat that would deliver the faithful from the flood.

In all that generation, only Noah and his family found grace in the eyes of the Lord because they walked in God's way. Genesis 6:14 to 7:20;

THOSE WHO PERISHED IN THE FLOOD had been warned by the Lord through the preaching of Noah.



But they had refused to repent and turn to God's way. When they rejected God, they sealed their own doom.

Genesis 7:21-23

NOAH AND HIS FAMILY (eight souls) later stepped out of the boat into a fresh world washed clean of wickedness.

Faithful to God, they were saved through their trust and obedience.

God then provided that Noah and his descendants were to repopulate the earth. Genesis 8:16-22;



the descendants of Noah decided that their way was better than God's way.

God had told them to multiply and replenish the earth.

Instead, they began building the Tower of Babel in token of their resolve to band together in one place and rely on their own strength.



To defeat this rebellious purpose, God caused them to begin speaking in different languages.

Because they could not understand one another, they could no longer build the tower.

Mankind was soon scattered across the face of the earth but they still continued to depart from God's way.

Genesis 11:1-9;

JUST AS IN THE DAYS OF NOAH once again God chose from among a wicked generation a man of faith and obedience.



God brings hope to mankind by selecting Abraham to begin a line of descendants through whom Jesus, the Saviour, would come to bless all mankind.

Note that these promises were given to a man who was willing to walk in God's way.

The descendants of Abraham, a few generations later, were delivered from Egyptian slavery by Moses. Genesis 12:1-3;

MOSES IS ANOTHER GOOD EXAMPLE of a man willing to walk in God's way.

When Abraham's descendants. the Israelites, were slaves in Egypt, they grew into a mighty nation.

God chose Moses who led them to freedom.

Then on the top of Mount Sinai faithful Moses received God's Law for His people.


Returning from the mountain Moses found that God's people again were forsaking God's way.

Ignoring the plain commands of God, they had prepared a golden calf to worship and actually ascribed to the calf the glory of delivering them from Egyptian slavery.



MOSES PLEADED WITH GOD on behalf of those who repented.

The Second Commandment of God's Law condemned the making or use of images in worship.



"You shall not make unto yourselves any graven image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above or that is in the earth beneath you shall not bow down to them."

(Exodus 20:4-5; 32:31-35;)

WHILE MOSES WAS ON THE MOUNTAIN God also gave him detailed plans for the construction of the Jewish place of worship, the Tabernacle.



Following God's way,
Moses built the Tabernacle
exactly as God had commanded.

God also gave His people complete instructions for worship.

So detailed were the instructions that God even told them where to get the fire to be used in certain offerings.

Exodus 35:1 to 40:38;

BUT DESPITE GOD'S INSTRUCTIONS, two priests, Nadab and Abihu, left God's way by using fire from a different source than the one ordained of God.



As an example to the whole nation of Israel, God sent fire from heaven and destroyed these disobedient priests.

Leviticus 10:1-4;

DURING THE FORTY YEARS Moses led the Israelites in the wilderness he had seen them ignore God time after time.



Before Moses died he solemnly charged the Israelites to keep God's Law that they might be blessed.



God's Law is authoritative and must be respected.

Moses also warned them of the dire consequences of departing from God's Word.

God has always designed laws for the personal happiness of those who will keep them.

God knows a man's needs far better than man himself.
Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 5-9; Isaiah 55:8-9;

AFTER THE DEATH OF MOSES God gave the Israelites the land of Canaan, the promised land of milk and honey.

They possessed cities already surrounded by walls, vineyards they had not planted, and fields they had not cleared.





As long as they served God, they enjoyed God's bountiful blessings and protection from their enemies. Joshua 3:1-12; 24:13;



HOWEVER IT WASN'T LONG until they turned away from God again by worshiping images.



The nation turns back to idolatry.

This is another of the numerous examples which show that Regardless of God's many blessings, man has never remained faithful to Him for very long.

Because God loved His people,
He sent His prophets
to warn them of their doom,
but the people refused to change.
Joshua 24:20-23;

AFTER A LONG HISTORY OF DEPARTURES from God's way

His people were dragged from their homes in the land of Palestine to serve as slaves of their enemies in foreign lands.



Their land was laid waste and their temple destroyed.

God had been merciful and patient.

The people could
blame only themselves
for their woeful plight.

2 Kings 17:7-23;

BUT GOD STILL CARED For His people and sent preachers or prophets, like Ezekiel, to turn them back to His way.



While some listened, many still ignored the pleading of God through His prophets.

Therefore, they continued to serve in slavery for many years.
2 Kings 25:8-21;

WHILE GOD'S PEOPLE WERE
IN SLAVERY in a foreign land, Daniel,
another prophet, prayed that they
might return to God and be restored
to their homes in the Promised Land.



With the passing of time, the people did repent.

Through His providence
God brought a nation into power
which allowed His people
to return to their homes.
Daniel 9:1-19;

GOD FINALLY SENT His only begotten Son to lead the whole world back to Him.



Christ came first to the Jews who so often before had rejected God.

Surely they would listen to God's own Son!

John the Baptiser pointed the Jews to Jesus, "Behold the lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." (John 1:29;)

Again the Jews departed from God. They refused to receive Jesus as the Messiah, the Son of God.



Ultimately they caused Jesus to be crucified by the Roman soldiers, thinking this would silence Him and His followers forever.

BUT EVEN DEATH COULD NOT OVERPOWER THE SON OF GOD!



Jesus conquers the power of death.

God miraculously raised Him from the dead, proving beyond any doubt that He is God's Son.

Instead of ending
Jesus' life and His teachings
as the Jews had hoped:-

Jesus brutal death was the occasion for His triumphant resurrection. This ultimately brought about the beginning of the reign of Christ and the establishment of His new covenant people, His new kingdom family.

Christ's body the assembly and the spread of Christianity throughout the world.

Matthew 16:18; Acts 2;
