

The Two Trees and What They Mean
The Psychological Effects of Sin and shame
and a Holistic Redemption.



While in the beautiful garden God's children enjoyed a perfect home.

In addition, they could eat of the "Tree of Life" and all the other trees in the garden except the one forbidden tree.

But Satan appealed to Eve's vanity and insisted that God had unduly restricted them.

Satan further insisted that she would not die as God had warned, but promised she would become wise like God.

# So Eve yielded to the temptation and ate the forbidden fruit.

Then she shared it with her husband.
Instead of becoming wise,
they became ashamed and tried to hide from
God because they knew they had sinned.

In the Bible the word "sin" means disobedience to God's will. Gen 2:16-17; 3:1-7; 1 John 3:4;

Because of their sin Adam and Eve died spiritually and as a consequence of removal from the tree of life they began to die physically.



#### Characteristics of Humans.

Genesis 2:25; unashamed, uninhibited & free Integrated – at peace with themselves Soon lost. – 3:7-8; Replaced with guilt, shame, and anxiety

"The woman looked at the tree and it looked good - she saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was desirable to make one wise" (Genesis 3:6;)

If you let your life be driven by what LOOKS good, you will doom your life to an existence of sin and misery. We are never called to follow that which LOOKS good. We are called to follow that which IS good.

Gen 3:6; "The woman looked at the tree and it looked good she saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was desirable to make one wise."

These three areas correspond to three types of temptation outlined in John 2:16; For all that is in the world, the lust of the FLESH and the lust of the EYES and the boastful PRIDE of life, is not from the Father, but is from the world.

Gen 3:6; "The woman looked at the tree and it looked good she saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was desirable to make one wise."

These are still the three "avenues" of temptation Satan uses today. (Matthew 4:1-11; 1 John 2:15-17;)

Eve was deceived but Adam was not. (1 Timothy 2:14;)

"And it was the woman, not Adam, who was deceived by Satan, and sin was the result."

Evidently Adam chose to go with Eve, otherwise they would have certainly been separated. He chose to die "for" her.

Did Jesus choose to die for His Bride? In what sense?



Gen 3:7; "At that moment, their eyes were opened, and they suddenly felt shame at their nakedness. So they strung fig leaves together around their hips to cover themselves.

Their EYES were opened in the sense that they now realised that they had disobeyed God and for the first time felt shame and fear.

The fear caused them to HIDE from God and their shame caused them to want to cover their "nakedness."

What they and we often don't realize is that nothing can be hidden from God.

Psychological alienation

Theological alienation

The fact that clothing was not necessary for protection from cold tells us something about the <u>climate and weather of this time</u>.



Gen 3:7; "At that moment, their eyes were opened, and they suddenly felt shame at their nakedness. So they strung fig leaves together around their hips to cover themselves.

The First Sin.

Consequences of Sin. (3:7-12;)
Shame – knew they were naked.
Fear – hid from God.
Guilt – cast blame.

Before Adam and Eve ate the forbidden fruit:- The man and his wife were both naked and were not ashamed. (Genesis 2:25;)

After they had eaten the forbidden fruit:-Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they were naked; Gen 3:7;



Gen 3:7; "At that moment, their eyes were opened, and they suddenly felt shame at their nakedness. So they strung fig leaves together around their hips to cover themselves.

A Sense of Shame.

Shame is a feeling we get when we do something wrong.

Being ashamed to be seen by God naked was a projection onto their body of the shame they felt from the sin of their soul.

Sin always has a psychosomatic effect.

Shame is a healthy emotion if it motivates us to do what God requires to make amends and be forgiven. In that case, shame is a good thing.

It's part of a healthy conscience.



Gen 3:9-11; "Then the LORD God called to the man, and said to him, "Where are you?" He said, "I heard the sound of You in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself." And He said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?."

#### LORD = YAHWEH.

LORD, written in all capitals represents the four letter word YHWH, the special covenant name of Israel's God, first given to Moses. (Exodus 6:2-4;)

We learn from Hebrews 1:10; that Jesus is LORD:
"He also says [to the Son]"

"In the beginning, O LORD, you laid the foundations of the earth, and the heavens are the work of your hands." See Psalm 102:1; & 25;



Gen 3:9-11; "Then the LORD God called to the man, and said to him, "Where are you?" He said, "I heard the sound of You in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself." And He said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?."

The "God" They Saw Was An Angel.

We know from other scriptures that this LORD God who walked and talked in the garden of Eden with Adam and Eve was really an angelic representative of God, in this case, of Jesus (John 1:18; 5:37; 6:46; 1 Timothy 6:15-16; Genesis 18;)

God said His Name was in this angel. (Exodus 23:20-23;)

See also Acts 7:30-32, 35, 38, 53; Hebrews 2:2-3;)

Gen 3:8-9; "Toward evening they heard the Lord God walking about in the garden, so they hid themselves among the trees.

Then the LORD God called to the man, and said to him, "Where are you?" He said, "I heard the sound of You in the garden,"

#### QUESTIONS OF CONDEMNATION.

The coming of the Lord is not with lightning or peals of thunder. Instead we read that "And they heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day" (Genesis 3:8;)

Yet this had been enough for the man and the woman to hide themselves. It is now that the voice of God calls for them.

The God who Calls:-Then the Lord God called to the man; and said to him, "Where are you?" (Genesis 3:9;)

Gen 3:9; "Then the LORD God called to the man, and said to him, "Where are you?" He said, "I heard the sound of You in the garden."

There is something winsome about the picture that we see here of God calling for man as he hides in the garden.

It isn't merely a game of spiritual hide and seek.
It isn't thank God that He did not know
where Adam and Eve were hiding.

God's questions are designed to force Adam to come to terms with his sin.

Gen 3:9; "Then the LORD God called to the man, and said to him, "Where are you?" He said, "I heard the sound of You in the garden."

We often make the mistake of thinking that our prayers of confession are for God's sake.

That is far too limited a view of God. He wants us to confess OUR sins for OUR sake.

There is something about prayer and confession that brings healing to our own dislocated souls.

## Two Confessions. (Genesis 3:10-13;)

Gen 3:10-11; "And he said, "I heard the sound of Thee in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself."

And He said, "Who told you that you were naked?

Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?"

The truth comes out. It is that both Adam and Eve had felt the shame of their nakedness.

Where there had before been no shame, now guilt came and brought with it shame.

It is not that guilt is necessarily bad.

Guilt is a proper thing to experience if you are guilty.

When someone is guilty and does not experience the accompanying feelings of guilt, we say that such a one is pathological.


This is the kind of person who can commit murders and never feel anything.

When you are guilty, the first step in resolving your situation is to face your guilt and admit that you are guilty.

We call this confession.

It involves seeing the reality of your guilt and admitting that you are guilty.

It is only when we have come to this point that we will be ready to go to the next step of TRYING TO RESOLVE that which has made us guilty in the first place.



I do not think Adam and Eve were ashamed for God to see their naked bodies. God had created those bodies and pronounced them "very good."

It was their behaviour they were ashamed of.
Hiding in the bushes was just a natural
response to a feeling of inward shame.

Look on the street or a TV screen. What has happened to people's shame for sin?

A surface reading of the passage seems to indicate that the Serpent initially told the truth.

Their eyes WERE opened. They DID come to an experiential understanding of good and evil.

And most importantly, they didn't die!

## Or did they?

If we may read between the lines, then let me Suggest that a death DID take place on that day.

It was a spiritual death. Their ability to freely communicate with God was disrupted. This is seen in their reaction to the presence of God.

So it is with sin. Sin doesn't look so bad when you get away from the presence of the Lord. But when HE comes, sin looks awful.

"And they heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife HID THEMSELVES from the presence of the Lord God among the trees of the garden. (Genesis 3:8;)

Have you ever turned over a stone on a sunny day and seen a big Beetle or cockroach?

What does it do? It scurries out of the light. It hates the light. It tries to hide from the light. Adam and Eve tried to do the same thing.

And this is judgment, that the light is come into the world, and men loved the darkness rather than the light, for their deeds were evil. For everyone who does evil hates the light, and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed. (John 3:19-20;)

It's easy to be dirty in the dark. It doesn't show. But put a bright light on dirt and everyone can see it.

That is why some people don't like to be around Christians if they are living the life they ought. It makes others feel strangely uncomfortable.



What brought the realization of their nakedness and the sense of shame that accompanied it?

Was it something in the fruit itself that put knowledge into the brains of Adam and Eve?

Or was it the projection of a sense of shame for disobeying God onto their bodies?

They not only tried to hide their bodies but also themselves from the presence of God.



### **Ashamed of What?**

We can't really be ashamed of our bodies.

After all, God created them to be what they are.

There can be no natural shame between a married couple and God for God to see their bodies.

So the sense of shame must have come from something else.

My theory is that the sin of their soul was what they were trying to hide and they had a psychosomatic reaction. They transferred the sense of shame for the sin of their soul onto their bodies.



## Why Wear Clothes?

Although we should not be ashamed of our bodies, there are several reasons why we should wear clothes in public.

Besides the comfort factor, to be protected from cold or from the sun's rays, there is the effect our nudity will have on those who must look upon it.

Some of our body parts are more presentable than others.

I don't know how you feel, I think most people, would rather not see a bunch of naked people walking around.



Adam and Eve were at first naked and not ashamed of their nakedness.

Husbands and wives are not embarrassed when they see each other naked in the privacy of their homes when no one else is present to see their nakedness.

I do not think there is a natural shame in nudity.

There is embarrassment for most people when they are caught naked in public.

And most of us do not want to live in a naked society and have to look at naked people.

#### A Time and Place.

There is a time and place for nudity and there are times and places when we do not want to be seen naked and we don't want to see other people naked in public.

Most of us don't cover our private parts because we are ashamed of having these parts but because they are not the most beautiful and presentable parts of our anatomy.

And if we and everyone else went around naked, we would be too much of a distraction to each other.



#### A Time and Place.

James 1:5; "If any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to him."

1 John 1:8-10; "If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness."

"If we claim we have not sinned, we make Him out to be a liar and His word has no place in our lives."

The Story of Legion.

In Luke 8:26-39; there is a story about a man possessed by many demons.

There were so many he, or the demons speaking through him, told Jesus his name was Legion because there were so many demons.

A legion is a regiment of Roman troops in number between 5 and 6 thousand.

For a long time this man had lived outdoors naked among the tombs.



Clothed and in His Right Mind.


After Jesus cast out the demons, the people in the nearby village came out to see him.

The Bible says they found him clothed and in his right mind.

Wearing clothes is normal in polite society and nudity in public not normal.

When a person comes to his or her "right mind" he or she will want to cover up

You are all sons of God through faith, in Christ Jesus. Because all of you who have been baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ (Galatians 3:26-27).



A Covering for Sin.

The shame of their soul they projected onto their bodies.

There is no way possible for man to cover his own shame. The transaction in the factual story also has spiritual significance.

"When one is baptised in water for the forgiveness of sins, he or she is also covered in Him so that when God looks at him or her, all He sees is His Son and not the shameful sins that were forgiven by His blood. Galatians 3:26-29;



We Can't Hide Anything from God.

Getting back to the psychology of sin:-We can't hide the shame of our sin by trying to cover it up in any way.

We certainly can Never hide anything from God.

But we see all kinds of psychological problems among humans caused by their rationalisations or attempts to deny reality or because they act in abnormal ways to deny or cover up sinful behaviour.

Good Mental Health. is predicated upon seeing things as they are and changing the things we don't like if we can.

Accepting the things we can't change and having the wisdom to know the difference.

God can help us have the wisdom to know the difference and He will forgive us of any sin if we are willing to repent of and ask Him to forgive. He gives us a "clean slate."

Gen 3:10; "And he said, "I heard the sound of Thee in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself."

Innocence, once lost, can never be restored.

There is the knowledge that you have sinned.

Once a sinner, always a sinner.

It's a little like the nail holes in a board.

Before the nails were driven into the board, the board was unmarred.

When God forgives a person's sins, it's like He pulls out the nails. But can the holes also be removed?

If we ignore or sublimate our sense of shame by brazen immodesty or rationalise it away, we will suffer.

Remember, Jesus was naked and publicly shamed for you so you won't have to be at the judgment.

Your white robe of His righteousness, will cover the shame of sin.




A Full Redemption:- there is good news for us sinners. Jesus, by His work on the cross.

with His burial and descent into Hades,
His resurrection and His ascension,
provides a full redemption for man's body,
spirit and soul. (1 Thessalonians 5:23;)

The nails are pulled from our board when God removes the guilt and punishment for sin. He fills the holes with something better than wood

His Love and the Holy Spirit. (Romans 5:1-5;) That is better than a restoration of innocence!



# Man Body Spirit Soul 1 Thess. 5:23

A Holistic Redemption or Salvation:-

Jesus' work of redemption was for the whole person. The body is redeemed at the resurrection at the Last Day. (Rom 8:10-11, 23;)

The spirit is redeemed the instant it obeys the simple commands of the Law of the Spirit of Life in Christ Jesus. (Romans 8:1-2; 6:17-18, 1-4; 1 John 5:13).

The redemption of the soul (the mind) is a process that goes on all through a person's life. This is the psychological redemption.



What is Better than Innocence?
Think about it. Adam and Eve would have had an easy life there in that luxurious garden.

But what opportunities would they have had to develop a strong character?

What happened to many of their descendants illustrates the biblical principle that no matter how bad things become.

If people honour and obey God above all others,
He can, and ultimately will,
bring good out of any bad situation.

#### **Eternal Life Now:-**

Jesus said that knowing God IS eternal life. "Now this is eternal life: that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent. John 17:3;

"To know," by the Bible's definition, is to have an intimate personal relationship with someone, in this case, with God through His Son.

If we have that relationship, we know God and what is more important, He knows us. So we can have eternal life within us NOW.

### 1 John 5:13;

"I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God so that you may know that you have eternal life."

Romans 8:10; "But if Christ is in you, your body is dead because of sin, yet your spirit is alive because of righteousness.

"You were all immersed into Christ. So, you were all clothed with Christ. You are all children of God through faith in Christ Jesus. for all of you who have been baptized into Christ, have clothed yourselves with Christ." Gal 3:26-27;



#### WHAT WAS THE KNOWLEDGE?

God had called the tree from which Adam and Eve ate, "The Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil."

Was it something in the fruit itself that enlightened the mind or was it the experience of sinning against God,

and that realisation that brought the shame that was then projected onto the body – something spiritual that was transferred to the physical?


Was this the first evidence of a psychosomatic effect of mental stress?

#### WHAT DID THEY LEARN?

I think the tree of the knowledge of good and evil represented God's law that defines good and evil or right and wrong.

In the sense that God gave them a single command regarding that tree, not to eat its fruit.

As symbols, the two trees stand for God's laws in any dispensation. (Romans 8:1-2;)



The Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil stood as a test of man's trust in God.

Man will never be without such a test in this life.

Satan appears in many forms and serves God's purpose in bringing tests of our trust in God.

God wants us to love and obey Him because we have made an informed and moral choice to do so.

Faith is therefore a moral choice.

No amount of kind of evidence will convince the person who does not want to believe.

The "Good" and How They Learned It.

The good they learned from the tree was that had they not disobeyed God everything would have remained good in their lives.

Once they lost that goodness, they realised what they had lost. Expressed in negative terms, good is not having to suffer harm.

Adam and Eve had it good but did not realize how good they had it until they lost what they had. Now they know the difference.



#### **GOOD AND EVIL.**

They now understood that what they had done was evil because it brought God's curse upon them.

They lost the good life and their close relationship with God. They now could appreciate the difference between good and evil.

Obeying God is good because it brings good to oneself and others.

Disobeying God is evil because it brings evil (harm) to oneself and others.

## No Knowledge in the Fruit



No "Smart Apple"

Gen 3:10; "And he said, "I heard the sound of Thee in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself."

So, the knowledge was not intrinsic in the fruit, whatever that was.

The knowledge was in the breaking of the one simple law God had given them.

This is how we learn the difference between good and evil today. We educate our sensitive conscience by reading or hearing God's law expressed in words.

We also get knowledge of good and evil through disobeying God's laws and experiencing the consequences or seeing them happen in other people's lives.

Gen 3:10; "And he said, "I heard the sound of Thee in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself."


We do not become sinners until we disobey a law of God.

#### **Romans 7:9-11**;

"Once I was alive apart from law; but when the commandment came, sin sprang to life and I died. I found that the very commandment that was intended to bring life actually brought death."

But we become accountable for a sin if we have learned the law through reading it or hearing it expressed, and then break it.

Adam and Eve were accountable for their sin because God had told them in simple terms not to eat from the particular tree.



We are not Born Sinners.

Babies are not born sinners as some teach.

We know many churches teach the so-called total hereditary depravity of man.

We know it from the fact that they sprinkle water on babies' heads so if they die in infancy or childhood they will not go to hell.

Gen 3:10; "And he said, "I heard the sound of Thee in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself."

No Such Thing as a Sinful Nature.

As far as I can tell, Augustine of Hippo in North Africa was the first to teach that we inherited Adam's sinful nature.

Roman Catholics and many of the churches that come from the Calvinist tradition teach this false doctrine.

The New International Version of the Bible perpetuates this false doctrine by "translating" "flesh" as "sinful nature."

Their mistranslation is common in the Book of Romans.

# SARX means FLESH Not sinful nature.

The underlined Greek word in Romans 7:18; means "flesh." Its basic form when spelled with English letters is "SARX," and it means "flesh," not "sinful nature."

## God Formed Man's Body from Earth Go Forms d Man's Spirit from Spirit

May your whole spirit, soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Adam is the Father of Our Flesh.

Sometimes it is the weakness of the flesh that makes it easier for us to sin. But we are not born sinners just because Adam sinned.

So when Adam was put out from the garden he began to die a physical death.

Therefore the consequences of loosing access to the tree of life applies only to our flesh, not to our souls.

Gen 3:10; "And he said, "I heard the sound of Thee in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself."

God "formed" (past tense) man's body from the dust of the earth.

This was a one-time thing. Only Adam's body was thus formed. (Gen 2:6-7;)

God "forms" (present tense) each man's spirit within him, not from dust but from His own Spirit. (Zechariah 12:1-2;)

## Man From Adam Body ← Indirectly (through Spirit our parents) From God → (His Spirit) directly → Soul 1 Thess. 5:23

Gen 3:10; "And he said, "I heard the sound of Thee in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself."

Man is a Composite Being.

As we said before, Adam is the father of our flesh but God is the Father of our spirit.

Each person's spirit comes directly and individually from God, formed inside each person in the womb. (Zechariah 12:1-2;)

When we die the Bible says:- "the dust returns to the earth as it was, and the spirit returns to God who gave it."

The soul is sinless until it chooses to break a law that it has learned by the usual means and knows to be a law of God.



Gen 3:10; "And he said, "I heard the sound of Thee in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself."

# Eternal damnation is not the only consequence of breaking God's law.

It's true that if we will not repent and get God's forgiveness for a sin, we will eventually end up in a very bad place.

But without doing or seeing evil for what it is, we would not be able to really understand what sin is.

And there are plenty of consequences of breaking God's laws that will teach us the value of obedience to Him and the horrors of disobedience.

Gen 3:12; "Yes, Adam admitted, "but it was the woman you gave me who brought me the fruit, and I ate it."

The man's confession:- And He said, "The woman whom You gave to be with me, she gave me from the tree, and I ate." (Genesis 3:12;)

As confessions go, this one is barely adequate.
The man enters into what we call the "blame game."
He seems to hint that a part of the reason for HIS sin is because of the actions of others.

He blames the woman. She is the one who gave him the forbidden fruit.

This suggests that he is also trying to place a portion of the blame on God who gave the woman in the first place.

Gen 3:13; "Then the Lord God said to the woman, "What is this you have done?" And the woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate."

The woman's confession:-

Just as the man placed the blame upon the woman, so she also followed his example and placed her blame upon the serpent.

The man did not claim deception, but she does.

She states that the serpent deceived her.

The man The woman The blames- who blames- Serpent

By contrast, Jesus offered no retort or defence when He was falsely accused. He bore the guilt and the sin that belonged to us so that WE could be credited, with HIS perfect righteousness.

Gen 3:13; "Then the Lord God said to the woman, "What is this you have done?"

And the woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate."

The Curse of Sin:-

Think about the consequences Adam and Eve suffered for one act of disobedience. They suffered spiritual death that very day (Spiritual death is eternal separation from God.)

Isaiah 59:2; "Your iniquities have separated you from your God; your sins have hidden His face from you, so that He will not hear."

"The widow who lives for pleasure is dead even while she lives." 1 Timothy 5:6; This is true of everyone, not just widows.



Gen 3:13; "Then the Lord God said to the woman, "What is this you have done?" And the woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate."

Because they lost access to the tree of Life. They began the process of physical entropy or decay that would bring about their physical death.

They were removed from the beautiful garden with its easy comfortable lifestyle.

They were forced into a life of struggle, pain and sorrows.

Gen 3:13; "Then the Lord God said to the woman, "What is this you have done?" And the woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate."

The Bible defines spiritual death as a break in the fellowship man had – that every man had – with God or a severed relationship.


A person is alive in his body of flesh but is separated from God for eternity if he does not reconcile himself to God.

The reconciliation must be on God's terms. We cannot make the rules.

#### **Christ's Sacrifice – Who Died?**

Heb 9:22 ...without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness.


Gen 3:10; "And he said, "I heard the sound of Thee in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself."

"Know ye not, that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death?"


"that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father;"

#### **Eve was Deceived, not Adam?**

In 1 Timothy 2:14; Paul says the woman was deceived but the man was not.

Nevertheless, Adam ate the forbidden fruit.

The question is "Why?" Think about it.

If he had not eaten the fruit he would have stayed in the garden, or so he thought.

Eve would have been driven out alone.

It is possible that Adam made a deliberate, conscious choice to sin so he could be with his wife.

What do you think?



#### Conclusion.

Man had a close relationship with God in the beautiful garden.

His life there was pleasant.

But God had to test man's trust and love.

Otherwise he would have been just like a robot with no real choice.

But then God could not give man the eternal reward He had planned for him.

In the new body God would give man after a period of testing, man would live forever in the presence of God and see His face.

God gave man one simple law. He was to stay away from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil.

If he ate its fruit he would be eternally separated from God.

This is what He meant when He told the man that in the day he sinned he would die.

Man chose to defy God and disobey.

He lost an innocence he can not regain.

But he can be TOTALLY forgiven

and restored to full fellowship with God.

When man realised what he had done, he tried to cover up his shame, his sense of failure, by covering his body with a fig-leaf garment and hiding among the trees.

He learned that he could not hide his shame from God but had to repent and restore his relationship with God on God's terms.

But there was no real covering for sin until God's Son came to earth and became the Perfect Sacrificial Lamb.



Like the first law, the second law of God is also a simple one. Man has to eat from the other tree, the Tree of Life, now the Cross, in order to be restored to fellowship with God. (Romans 8:1-2;)

Eating the Fruit of the Spirit's Tree of Life is re-enacting the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus in baptism in order to allow the blood of Christ to take away our sin.

Matt 28:19-20; Acts 2:38; Romans 6:4-6,17; Gal 3:26-27;

The cross of Jesus is called "The Tree" in Acts 13:29; and 1 Peter 3:24;

As Jesus said:- (John 4:34). "My food is to do the will of Him Who sent Me."


#### **Cover Up:-**

When you realise that you have sinned against God you will be ashamed.

There is only one way to cover that shame and that is to be clothed with Christ. (Galatians 3:26-29;)

As God provided clothing acceptable to Him, made from the skins of sacrificed animals, so He has now provided the only satisfactory covering for the shame of our sin in His Only Son.

Enter Him today through faithful obedience including baptism in water for the forgiveness of our sins. (Galatians 3:26-29; Acts 2:38;)



There is a physical component as well as a spiritual component in baptism.

When one goes down into the water he loses the filthy rags of sin with which he was covered and puts on the white robe of righteousness he receives in and through the Christ.

# God's Counselling:Remember the counselling God provided for Cain (Genesis 4:7;)?

He has always provided counselling for those who will listen.

He counselled the Jews to be baptized when John the Baptizer came on the scene. When they refused to be baptized the Bible says they "rejected the counsel of God against themselves." (Luke 7:30;)

He counsels us to obey and be saved.

Mark 16:15-16;



Through the gospel and the body of Christ, God has provided the redemption, spiritual and psychological, that comes through the counsel of those who are spiritual. (Galatians 6:1-2;)

Among these will usually be the elders of the church, as well as other spiritual men and women who have the skills necessary.

He promised that all who obey Him. (Acts 2:38-39; 5:32) would receive the Holy Spirit Who would be their counsellor.

Guided by the Holy Spirit, we all have the counsel of God's word.
